# 1. Safeguarding Policy

#### 1. Introduction

Elroy Housing and Community Support CIC is committed to ensuring the safety, protection, and welfare of all vulnerable individuals, particularly children, young people, and adults at risk who access our services. Safeguarding is a core responsibility embedded in all areas of the Organisation's operations.

This policy outlines the Organisation's approach to safeguarding, ensuring that:

- All staff and volunteers understand their responsibilities to protect people from abuse and neglect.
- Clear procedures are followed for identifying, reporting, and responding to safeguarding concerns.
- We meet legal and regulatory obligations as outlined in the relevant legislation.
- Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility, and we expect all members of the Organisation, from board members to part-time volunteers, to be vigilant and responsive.

### 2. Legal and Regulatory Framework

This policy is guided by the following legislation and statutory guidance:

### Scope

This policy applies to all staff, volunteers, contractors, and partners working with or on behalf of Elroy Housing and Community Support CIC.

### **Principles**

- Promote a culture of zero tolerance to abuse or neglect.
- Ensure all concerns or allegations are taken seriously and responded to promptly.
- Maintain confidentiality and dignity of the individual at all times.

## Reporting

All safeguarding concerns must be reported immediately to the Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL). In serious or urgent cases, concerns should be escalated to the relevant local authority or police.

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
