### Sherbornes with Pamber

As I write this article, the news of the death of our beloved Queen is just filtering through. I imagine we can all recall where we were when we heard the news. It's of that magnitude.

Elizabeth II will be remembered on so many levels but I am sure the way she discharged her duties with the highest levels of service, humility, grace, integrity, dignity and her sense of duty will be at the top of the list. Perhaps the warmest tribute is that she has been referred to as the nation's mother, grandmother and great grandmother. We feel she was one of us and part of our extended family.

For those of us under the age of 70 she has been our only monarch and for all of us she has represented continuity, stability and reliability through the ups and downs of our, and our country's fortunes. We will miss her deeply.

And it begs the question; what was her source of encouragement? Whilst she has been a rock of stability to so many, I am sure the Queen would humbly submit that Jesus Christ has been her rock. This was clear from the very beginning – her accession to the throne. She was just 25 when she became Queen on the death of her beloved father, and she immediately set out to understand what her new role would entail. Central to this was understanding how her Christian faith would shape her reign.

In her first Christmas broadcast in 1952 some months before her coronation, she said this:

'Pray for me ... that God may give me wisdom and strength to carry out the solemn promises I shall be making, and that I may faithfully serve Him and you, all the days of my life.'

For Christians everywhere, the Queen has been a wonderful example of a life spent living out her Christian faith in public. This shone through in what she said and how she conducted her life.

The examples are myriad in number and I just want to briefly pick out three aspects of her faith.

#### 1. Jesus was her teacher.

Whilst she was steadfast and enduring in her service of her subjects, she was also unflinching and confident in the promises of God through his son Jesus Christ. This was her source of strength and influenced everything in her life.

In 2014 she confirmed this in the Christmas broadcast of that year:

"For me, the life of Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace, whose birth we celebrate today, is an inspiration and an anchor in my life. A role model of reconciliation and forgiveness, he stretched out his hands in love, acceptance and healing. Christ's example has taught me to seek to respect and value all people, of whatever faith or none."

#### 2. Jesus was her example of service

The Queen's life was marked by her steadfast dedication to serve.

In 2008 the Queen said: 'I hope that, like me, you will be comforted by the example of Jesus of Nazareth who, often in circumstances of great adversity, managed to live an outgoing, unselfish and sacrificial life ... He makes it clear that genuine human happiness and satisfaction lie more in giving than receiving; more in serving than in being served.'

### 3. Forgiveness and reconciliation were her watchwords

The Queen brought people together and promoted peace and mutual respect. Just two examples - on her accession, the Commonwealth consisted of just a handful of countries. Now there are 56 covering every continent and encompassing a third of the world's population. She was the first British monarch in modern times to visit the Republic of Ireland and in a symbolically significant way helped to bring peace after many years of strife.

In 2011 she said, 'Forgiveness lies at the heart of the Christian faith. It can heal broken families, it can restore friendships and it can reconcile divided communities. It is in forgiveness that we feel the power of God's love.'

The Queen has given us a wonderful example of living out one's faith in humility, dignity, and gentle authority by having the heart of a servant, giving so much of herself to others and by giving her heart to Jesus Christ, her Lord and Saviour.

Whether you are a Christian or not, her words on the occasion of her Golden Anniversary in 2002 extol a wonderful way to live:

"I know just how much I rely on my faith to guide me through the good times and bad. Each day is a new beginning. I know that the only way to live my life is to try to do what is right, to take the long view, to give of my best in all that the day brings, and to put my trust in God!"

On 12th September, the Sherbornes with Pamber Parochial Church Council met with the Archdeacon of Winchester (Richard Brand) and the Lay Chair of the Romsey Deanery (Sarah Boothman) to discuss how we move forward as a parish following the resignation of Daniel Newman as Rector. Daniel was in post for a little over 2 years and prior to that John Hamilton had been our Rector for over 30 years. Consequently Bishop David, the Archdeacon and the PCC all agreed it would be helpful to conduct a review to provide guidance and support over the coming months leading into the recruitment process for a new minister.

The Archdeacon was clear that this review should not slow down the recruitment process but is intended to provide greater clarity and assurance as to the way ahead. Whilst not a public consultation, the review will engage a wide range of church members, including those most closely involved in the running of the parish and its churches.

Richard and Sarah will start the review process immediately. They hope to complete this review by the end of November with the recruitment process starting as soon as practical after then.

#### PARISH COUNCIL

The Chairman and the existing Parish Councillors are delighted to welcome Jane Bechelet as our new co-opted member of the Parish Council. (Jane is co-opted until the next election when she would formally be elected)

Cllr Rowley and the NP Committee have been progressing their work to update the Neighbourhood Plan with our consultant partners working on some of the reports which will update the existing Plan which is still valid.

We have also received the Environmental and Heritage reports supporting our objections to the Rydon proposed plans

Basingstoke and Deane are continuing their work on the Local Plan.

There is a petition instigated by Maria Miller MP against the numbers being proposed for BDBC – details were in the Basingstoke Gazette, your Parish Council urge you to sign it.

The Parish Council has been notified of 3 planning applications Rosevale Cottage, Weybrook Court and Pippins Mount – we will be responding shortly – if you have any objections to raise please let the Clerk know as soon as possible via email: clerk@sherbornestjohn-pc.gov.uk

With the growth of our lovely village, the requirement for greater efficiency, day to day management of the Chute Pavilion, our allotments and other assets, together with the need for additional financial governance, the Parish Council has approved the purchase of a software package "Scribe" which will installed in the coming months bringing us more technologically up to date. We have had demonstrations from a couple of suppliers and feel this package is most suited to our needs and will be easy to use.

We again urge villagers to continue to use the village shop - USE IT OR LOSE IT

Speeding through the village and on the A340 – a constant perennial problem – discussions remain ongoing with the Police Commissioner- you may have noticed recent rubber strips on Chineham Lane.

Sadly, the day after our last Parish Council meeting, we heard our beloved Queen Elizabeth II had passed away peacefully at the grand age of 96. The majority of us will never have known a time when the Queen was not there, we will miss her.

Hopefully many of you will have signed the "In Memorium" book which was in the Village Hall or extended your condolences by other means to the new King Charles and the royal family.

God save the King.

## SSJ Lychgate Appeal



Time to update you on the progress of the appeal for our village lychgate, which was launched in the August edition of the Villager. This gave some historical background on lychgates in general and on our lychgate, which was built in 1887 to commemorate the golden jubilee of Queen Victoria.

Parts of this lychgate are now in a sorry state; we wish to smarten up this area of our village heritage and to get the project underway in this Platinum Jubilee year of our Queen Elizabeth; as I write I hear the news that an era has just come to an end with the passing of our beloved Queen.

We have so far received about £2000 in contributions from members of our community. The Benefact Trust (which some of you might know by its former name the All Churches Trust) has kindly donated £1500 and our Parish Council has in principle very generously agreed to award £1500 as well. We express our warmest thanks to both bodies and to all contributors from our local community.

These contributions have provided enough funds for the project to proceed. Planning for this is already underway. We intend for work to commence within the next few months.

We are pleased and thankful for all donations received so far but you will see that we are still a few thousands short of our target so are still seeking contributions. Further donations would serve a double purpose of contributing to the renovation of a village gem and of paying tribute to our longest reigning monarch.



### News from the Hospital

As most of us are increasingly aware, the NHS is in crisis, and one that is steadily getting worse. Trying to speak to a GP is difficult, but worse still is the effort to try and see one - always different each time, negating any chance of a doctor getting to know their patient, and being more proactive in early disease diagnosis. All of this means that people are increasingly resorting to going to their local A & E department, adding additional load on the hospital. Often serious illnesses are now not being identified early enough to result in a good clinical outcome.

So what is happening? Perhaps a clue: of the £1.5Bn extra funding recently announced for the NHS, only £4M will come towards the hospital, and then with strings attached! Looking more deeply, whilst the hospital has increased its clinical staffing over the period of the pandemic by 17%, not only raising its rating from "needs improvement" to "good", it has also had to cope with Covid. By contrast, as identified by the Policy Exchange think tank, staffing levels at Government departments and the central bodies running the NHS have doubled their headcount!

As a result of a very successful recruitment programme, vacancies in the Trust are now down, and it is hoped that as more normal working expands, the use of expensive agency workers will subside. In particular, a large number of student nurses have been offered

places and many more midwives are now employed, adding to safety in that department. Shortly we should also benefit from a new group of nurses who complete their degree courses this summer. However, with the new NHS focus of 'Care in the Community' there is real concern about the ability to recruit sufficient trained staff and funding to meet this aspiration.

The number of inpatients with Covid has started to rise again as a result of the BA4 and 5 mutations of the virus (which are much more transmissible and more likely to affect the lungs). Many of these have been admitted for other ailments, but the Trust's screening has identified them as positive. At the time of writing there were 119 patients across the Trust – also there have been more staff impacted and unable to resume normal working. Although spacing is being relaxed, mask wearing has been re-introduced. Considerable effort is being made to increase the volume of elective work, although this is still not yet at a level to start significantly eating into the backlogs.

Again, with cancer treatment there is improvement, although there is real concern that due to Covid many cases are yet to be identified, and there could soon be a big increase of patients now needing urgent, more aggressive treatment. It is known that with certain high risk cancers the numbers seeking diagnosis during the pandemic was abnormally low, with a marked rebound

now expected. The Wessex region, of which we are part, has been particularly successful in finding these lost cases.

As is widely known, there are plans for a new hospital for Basingstoke. The national plan is for about 40 new hospitals in the next few years, with Basingstoke scheduled for the 2025-2030 building slot. It was encouraging that recently, at Maria Miller's invitation, the minster responsible for this new build programme was invited to visit the present facility, gaining a sound insight into why a new hospital is so critical in view of the declining structure on the present site.

Finally at a time of deep concern about the performance of the NHS, it seems that few are aware that they can become members of the Trust. Membership is free and open to all - patients, their families, friends and carers, hospital staff and everyone who wants to keep in touch with their local hospital service. Not only do members get a regular update from the hospital's CEO, with regular health talks, but they also have the opportunity to select governors to represent their interests to the Trust's management in their local area. 

### WHAT A 12-MONTHS WE HAVE HAD - WEATHERWISE

The summer of 2021 was warm with a day/night temperature some 2.5 C above the 30-year longterm average but it was also seriously wet, especially June with 88.7mm of rain (the average is only 50mm). The total summer rainfall was just shy of 200mm, that is 125% of normal. Autumn 2021 once more started rather wet and warm, but November saw a big change with a severe drop in temperature to below average temperatures in association with a big drop in rainfall (just 16.6mm against an average of 74mm).

The Winter of 2021/22 was, overall, fairly normal with temperatures a little above average and, consequently very little snow. During February winds were persistently from the southwest and so there were no seriously cold spells and fewer frosts; there were no nasty winds from Siberia.

The Spring of 2022 started to show a consistent warming trend with overall day/night temperatures 2.5C above the norm and rainfall beginning to decrease, especially in April with only 22.9mm of rain (43% of average).

The Summer of 2022 was exceptional for both warmth and lack of rainfall. The average daytime maximum temperature for the three months was 5.5C above average - 6.0C for the whole of both July and August - that must be a record! Although the June rainfall totalled 35mm, I only measured 1.0mm during July, and that was spread over 3 days and was therefore totally ineffective. This was followed by August with NO rain until the 16th.

The annual rainfall here over 12 months is about 758mm; in the 12 months to the end of August 2022 I have recorded a total of 558mm - that is 200mm short of the long-term average. We now wait and see just how much damage to the environment will result from this summer's problems.



Successfully growing vegetables, we now know, takes years of experience and a lot of trial, error and listening to the experts (thank you, Ted). The first year was a bit of a shock. I was under the illusion that you popped plants into the ground, watered them, weeded them, loved them and waited for a profusion of delicious, colourful, nutritious, home-grown veg. How quickly we were faced with reality!!



top of the site and over the years the 'good' soil has washed away to the lush plots at the bottom. The hot, dry spring of 2020 turned the ground into concrete, rabbits (or pigeons) ate the emerging

Our plot is at the

shoots of our onions and garlic, the caterpillars had the brassicas, the wind took the shed and the only thing we

cultivated with any success were the weeds. It was all very discouraging, and I think we might have given up if it had not been for Pete's bumper crop of pink fir apple potatoes which we were still eating in March 2021 (I'd be very happy never to see another one again but flushed with success, Pete is now harvesting his third crop). Our lovely 'neighbours' Keith and Nicky gave us strawberry plants, beetroot plants – and whatever else they had spare. Nicky made gentle suggestions which really helped. Ted was a constant, and very

patient, source of advice. We built some raised beds and Pete spent weeks moving compost from our heap in the garden up to the allotment in his wheel-barrow – a productive way to spend his lockdown exercise hour.

We produced strawberries, potatoes, rhubarb, onions and garlic (second planting!), leeks and beetroot. I planted lavender, thyme, oregano and rosemary to attract the bees and other insects.



This year been a challenge with temperatures reaching record highs and a lack of rainfall. The weeds have, once more, been able to survive and thrive

and refuse to be unearthed. However, we have had some successes and have learnt a lot. Having an allotment is about learning to live with successes and failures and to accept that you have no control over the weather. It is hard work but when you bring home and cook your own 'crops' the effort is definitely worth it.

### **WOMEN'S FELLOWSHIP**

The September meeting was a Talk by speaker Mr Nick Gibbs, titled 'How Lockdown Saved My Damaged Brain' an inspirational account of his life prior to, during and after his cycle accident in 2014.

Nick Gibbs' greatest love was always publishing, which he was involved in for 25 years. He set up his own business, Freshwood Publishing, when he edited magazines involving three different crafts, namely woodworking, sailing and the more short-lived crossstitching. The seven years he spent editing were happy and fulfilled, until one fateful day when he had a cycle accident in Gloucestershire and had a stay in hospital, in Bristol, for six months. He spent the first ten days in

a coma, after which he was confused and hallucinating. He gave us medical phrases such as 'drowsy versus noisy brain', Deprivation of Liberty Order and getting a Pedlar's Certificate. He was also a craftsman, working in wood-turning mainly, and following his accident he made wooden helicopters, reminiscent of the sycamore seeds which children twist and let go, watching them swivel to the ground. He sold a number of these, and continues to make them.

A turning point in his life came when he read Olympic Rower James Cracknell's book Touching Distance, which inspired him to return to his love of editing magazines. He set up his magazine Quercus, a bi-monthly magazine which he works on today, as well as giving talks to groups like the Women's Fellowship, and donating fees to Headway.

The account of Nick's days and weeks following his accident were harrowing as well as amusing, and members present were overwhelmed by his account of his experiences. He was thanked by Rose Cooper and there was a short Q & A session. Fortunately the meeting included Harvest Tea, which Nick devoured both before and after his talk. when he continued to chat.

Next month's meeting on the 4th October will be an Art Workshop by Heather Wylde. We look forward to seeing you all then. Visitors are always welcome, 2pm.

### Probus Hears About Life on the Magistrates' Bench





The likes of sayings "You're nicked!" and "Caught banged to rights" are not usually what a magistrate hears when dealing with the deeds of accused miscreants at the first level of the British legal system. Guest speaker at the latest meeting of the Probus Club of Basingstoke was Tony Hersh JP, who gave an insight into a day in the life of a Justice of the Peace.

He has been a magistrate in Basingstoke for about 5 years having spent a career in clinical research. He spoke about the history of magistrates, how long they have been in existence and the changes in their powers over time.

All cases start in this first tier of court justice which has a bench of usually three magistrates and work without a jury. They are limited to dealing with what are known as "summary offences" which include most motoring offences, minor criminal damage and common assault. Sometime burglary and drug offences. More serious cases, known as "indictable offences", are sent to the Crown Court.

He illustrated the types of punishment open to magistrates using the Sentencing Guidelines which provide a boundary on magistrates' judgements. They can impose fines, community service, driving bans and imprisonment up to 12 months. They can remand someone to prison to await trial at Crown Court which is one of the most difficult decisions magistrates have to make. Many months can pass before trial and if the defendant is then found not guilty, they receive no compensation for having spent time in prison.

Of particular interest, he demonstrated a series of actual cases ranging from

shoplifting to fraud and assault among others. He presented the evidence and the stance of the prosecution and defence, and the various sentencing options open to the magistrates. The audience was asked what they thought was appropriate before he disclosed the actual sentence imposed and the reasons behind it.

Anyone can apply to become a magistrate and the court service desire such volunteers to represent society at large. Naturally checks are made about applicants and references are sought but people can apply from aged 18 upwards. Considerable training is undertaken but retirement comes at the age of seventy five. However, the ability of retaining the honorific of JP after your name can be used until your demise.


