PARISH COUNCIL

A belated Happy New Year to all parishioners. I hope that 2023 is less of an 'annus horribilis' than 2022 was what with the passing of HM Queen Elizabeth II, other less painful but equally sad events and the turbulence that the PC experienced.

Planning

With the BDBC delay, approx. 1 year, in moving forward with the new Local Plan, this is turn delays the new SSJ Neighbourhood plan.

This delay has seen developers submit a number of applications, two of which impact SSJ;

- Weybrook Farm (220 houses)
- Kiln Farm (350 houses)

No formal planning application for either of these proposals has yet been submitted but applications for both are expected in the January/February timeframe.

The development of 26 houses at the back of Cranesfield has yet to be decided but the Parish Council understands that a number of objections e.g. landscape and conservation concerns, have been submitted by council officers and statutory bodies

We wait with bated breath as to the outcome.

SSJ Neighbourhood Plan

The process of developing a revised SSJ Neighbourhood plan, in support of a revised BDBC Local plan, is a marathon not a sprint. Developers are trying to exploit the current delay in the process of revising both plans, see above Planning.

However it's important to note that our current Neighbourhood Plan is still a 'live' document.

The Parish Council has engaged a planning consultancy to help revise the current Neighbourhood Plan, ET Planning Ltd.

The PC has received the anticipated funding in order to develop a new Neighbourhood Plan.

If you want to contribute to the development of the new SSJ

NeighbourhoodPlan, then Cllr Rowley, is your point of contact.

Coronation Celebrations

The PC anticipates holding an event to celebrate the coronation of HM King Charles III on or around the 6th May.

Speeding/Flooding

Some limited progress with speeding on the A340 between the two 30 mph signs. The police admit that there is a problem but....

Our new borough Councillor, David McIntyre, is chasing.

I recognise the other main issue is speeding along Elm Road - the destruction of the bollards by white van man early in January is an example of said speeding.

There is also the issue of flooding in Kiln Road, sometimes making it impassable on foot.

The management of the roads is the responsibility of HCC. Whilst the PC can take HCC to task, that's all that we can do.

There have been a number of requests for the PC to install cameras, etc. To put this into perspective the installation of a Gatso camera is north of £20k with ongoing maintenance adding another £1k per annum. This expense is about 50% of the SSJ an annual precept of approx. £45k. You can then perhaps understand that the PC's only way forward is to be a continual pain to BDBC/HCC and the local police.

Chute Pavilion

Our existing gas supply contract for the Chute expires at the end of March.

However our current supplier has refused to offer us a new fixed price contract because of the current volatility in the energy market.

The renewal tariff is significantly more than the current tariff.

We've yet to see the renewal offer from our electricity supplier.

The PC has always planned for the Chute to be self-funding but the increment re: the gas supply and an anticipated like price increment to the electricity supply puts that plan into jeopardy.

The next six months will see a number of 'must do' repairs to the Chute initiated. A number of these repairs might require the Pavilion to be closed for a short period of time. Further details to be provided as and when the repairs are scheduled.

Amor Armitage

Some of you may have read about the horrific accident that Amor suffered on December 17 resulting in her hospitalisation in Mexico. Amor runs a number of yoga classes at the Chute.

The PC understand that a JustGiving page raised over £100k enabling Amor to be flown home. She is now in intensive care in the UK where her treatment will continue for a number of months.

Parish Councillor

We now have a new Councillor, Jane Bechelet. Welcome Jane.

Parish Clerk

By the time this article is published we will have a new Parish Clerk.

MANY thanks to Mel Camilleri, our Locum Clerk, who kept us sane and sensible over the last 6 months.

We have three candidates for the position, all of whom offer a selection of useful skills/experience.

Lengthsman

The Lengthsman service has been extended for this fiscal year, April 2022 thru to March 2023.

2022/2023 - Finances

The PC anticipates a 4% increase to the SSJ Precept that forms part of the wider BDBC council tax. This increase is about £1.37 per annum for a band D house.

The PC understands that the BDBC element of your Council Tax bill will be frozen for the year 2023/2024.

General

The PC is now back to meeting on the last Wednesday at the Chute Pavilion each month.

Going forward the planning session will start @ 7.15 p.m. and the council meeting @ 7.45 p.m. As always it would be good to see parishioners at these meetings.

Play Area:

Recently the A frame was condemned by the Play Area Inspector and removed. However due to the support of Borough and County Councillor Grants a new wooden frame has been ordered as a replacement. Our grateful thanks to th Councillors for their continued help in maintaining this important facility. Discussion also took place regarding a new play area equipment scheme. It was resolved by obtaining grant funding to install a new set of equipment that is of wooden construction and more suitable to a rural setting and will provide the area with a new lease of life.

Potholes:

Residents are urged to report road surface issues on Hampshire Highways website www.hants.gov.uk as this is the most effective way to get the issues on our roads prioritised by the Highways department.

Precept:

Due to increasing costs, the Parish Council has applied an increase to the precept for financial year 2023/2024. In order to meet its financial obligations, and maintain the level of reserves recommended by the auditors, the precept is to be raised to £12,500 per annum. In real terms, the increase results in the average Band D property paying an additional £6.63 per annum from April 2023.

Planning:

Decisions continue to take much longer than normal to come to conclusion.

New Councillors:

Basingstoke Civil Service Retirement Fellowship

Pam informed us that the food bank was set up on 1st October 2012 so had been in operation for 10 years. In the first year, they supplied 1046 parcels for 2000 people. By last year this had increased to 2500 parcels for 5500 people, an increase of 45%. The parcels they supply are intended to last for approximately 3 days and she showed us an example of the different items included. These

parcels are only supplied to people who have been referred to the Food Bank by official bodies including Citizens Advice, Housing Associations, District Nurses, Schools etc. These parcels are then collected by the clients, although should the occasion arise, they can be delivered. Pam expressed thanks on behalf of the Food Bank and their clients for all the food and money donations received by the public and from members at the meeting. Women's Fellowship

The speaker at January's meeting was local resident Louise Levy who told members about her trip to Java, Bali and the Kimodo Islands in Indonesia.

Louise's background is Finance, where she spent time working for a major City Bank, and is now on the Board of two major banks in London. Looking for a change of scene, she applied for a voluntary job in Indonesia teaching English in a boarding school in Java to 14-17yr old pupils. The school had an intake of 3,000 students and Louise had responsibility for 90, 50% girls and 50% boys. Her plans for teaching Empowerment for Women had to change rapidly as the boys were also keen to learn, so it became simply Empowerment. The school was considered to be a 'Luxury School' with the parents paying fees. When Louise was there in November it was the Rainy Season, deluges in the morning with hot sun drying everything out in the afternoon. This resulted in very hot classrooms and dormitories, the latter having just a fan for the twenty pupils sleeping in bunk beds. Food arrived in buckets and the children helped themselves. Every day started at 3am and finished at midnight. The first three hours were spent with Prayers (it is an Islamic school) and classes began at 6am. Lateness was punished harshly, despite the pupils being very tired, living on just a few hours' sleep each night. Despite the school spending many hours each week immersed in the study of Islamic tradition, the school intends for its pupils to further their education in International Universities.

Louise's time at the school focussed on empowerment and moving forward into the world of business. The pupils started with their storyboard, moving on to creating their own CV. They were shown how to shift any negative beliefs into positive ones, ultimately replacing all negativity into positive structures. The work following this concentrated in producing ideas for the benefit of themselves and the world, covering themes of climate change, biodiversity and recycling - something non-existent in Java. Turning their ideas into workable projects was part of the process, and Louise was very proud that some of the students had produced bio-fuels from coffee, and a recycling App. Finance was crucial in all this, as without financial knowledge and experience, good ideas may not become good businesses.

As if this wasn't enough, Louise went on to an orphanage where more than two hundred children lived, mostly born out of wedlock – which is unacceptable in the Muslim community. The orphanage was run down but the children were happy. The main facilitators there were a 25yr old son of the founder, and a colleague, also 25 years old. Louise told us that bedding was sadly lacking, with few pillows and mattresses, and she will be setting up a fund to help with this.

She was thanked by Jenny Cooke for her illuminating talk.

Following Louise's talk there was a visit from SSJ residents James and Christine Crowley who gave a questionnaire to members, and James spoke about forthcoming possible housing in Basingstoke & Deane, the Neighbourhood Plan and solutions for retaining the village culture of Sherborne St John. There was a time for Q&A's afterwards.

The meeting ended with a quotation, and a reminder that February's meeting will be the AGM, Bring & Buy, and a talk on Birds and Birdlife.

Next month's meeting will be 2pm on Tuesday 7th February.

Probus Hears About The Immortal Memory



Many people have attended a Burns' Supper around 25th January, the birthdate of Robert Burns, the National Bard of Scotland, Scotland's Favourite Son, and will have witnessed the piping in of the haggis and someone giving the Address to a Haggis in "Lalland Scots" being virtually unintelligible to all the sassenachs present. But at the best of such occasions, irrespective of wherever in the world there is a Caledonian connection, the guest of honour has the responsibility of telling those present their view on Robbie Burns, the Ploughman's Bard.

Such was the situation outlined by the latest speaker at the Probus Club of Basingstoke, member John Kynoch. Although born in New Zealand, the son of an ex-pat Scot, as a teenager he came to join the family woollen manufacturing business in Scotland and lived for over thirty years in Keith, to the east of Inverness.

This talk, The Immortal Memory, was John's personal insights and long past connections with Robert Burns who was born in 1759 in Alloway, Ayrshire and died at the early age of thirty-seven. The sister of John's great grandfather married a man who was a friend of Burns whose own father started an educational establishment for apprentices that today is the Herriot Watt University in Edinburgh.

Around the time of Burns' birth, the British Empire was developing with Wolfe capturing Quebec making Canada British rather than French. George111 was soon to reign as was Catherine the Great in Russia, Hayden got a job making music in the court of Prince Esterhazy in Hungary and Captain Cook discovered New Zealand. Less than a decade before Burns was born the Duke of Cumberland, the King's brother, carried out the last battle on British soil at Culloden near Inverness defeating the final Jacobean rebels.

During his short life, the bard had been a tenant farmer, a flax dresser, a continual rebel against orthodox religion and eventually a Revenue & Customs Officer and a member of the militia in Dumfries, despite being a nationalist at heart. He also penned 559 writings of which 368 were songs often putting new lyrics to existing Scottish traditional and folk melodies.

At the age of 28, and only 14 months after his first book was published, Poems, Chiefly in the Scottish Dialect, Burns undertook a coach trip on poor roads around that part of north-eastern Scotland where the speaker had lived. In such a short time, and without the ease of communications we have today, his fame had spread to the extent that he was feted by the great and good. He was described as the equivalent of a Rock Star, a working-class hero, gifted beyond measure, attracted by and attracted to, the opposite sex (he had nine children with his wife, his last son born an hour after his death, and at least four more with other women) and finding further distraction in misuse of substances, in his case "the drink."

At one such meeting at Duff House, in Banff, Burns met a young boy who had his book at home and knew some of the poetry by heart which gives some idea of the popularity of the Bard's work. That a schoolboy in Banff, so far north from Ayrshire, where much was written, should be familiar with his

work so soon after it was published, is quite remarkable.

One can only marvel at the genius of this man who could produce such words that we still admire and can quote at times, almost off the cuff. Robert Burns was obviously a man of huge intelligence with a great understanding of the human condition. Words and ideas that have been translated into more than 60 languages around the world and used as reference points by many great people in history such as US President Abraham Lincoln who wrote of Burns "From Shakespeare I learnt the sonnets. From the Bible, the scriptures. But it was from this man that I learnt humility."

After the guest of honour has concluded their reminiscence about Robert Burns, they then request the audience, "Raise your glasses... the toast is.... to The Immortal Memory."


The final act at a Burns' supper and at Hogmanay, on New Year's Eve, throughout much of the world, is of course singing the famous farewell "Auld Lang Syne." This is one of Burns' songs that even sassenachs know.



What on earth is Hippotherapy?



No, I'm afraid there are no secret hippos in Hampshire. Hippos means horse in Greek. As a qualified physiotherapist for the past 15 years, and a specialist in Paediatrics for 9 years, I decided 4 years ago that I wanted to combine my love of physio, children and horses and enrolled on a Hippotherapy course. Yes, I must be mad; 3 years, a pandemic and a baby later, I qualified in Hippotherapy.

I use my physio skills as a Hippotherapist and utilise the movements of a horse to provide carefully graded motor and sensory input. The aim of these sessions is to use the movements of the horse for therapy which can improve:

- Balance
- · Core Strength
- Trunk Mobility and Symmetry
- Head and respiratory Control
- Co-ordination
- Stamina
- Communication

The warmth and movement of the horse along with the tactile feel of the coat and

mane will help sensory learning and toleration of strange environments and stimuli, as well as it contributing to a positive therapeutic experience.

Depending on the child's disability and needs, different positions on the pony can be used, such as facing backwards, sideways, four point kneeling, lying on their tummy or on their back.

Last year I set up my small business of H.O.P.E. (Horses Offering Physical Enrichment) Hippotherapy. Currently I work out of the Wellington and Dummer Riding for the Disabled's yard where I also volunteer for the RDA itself.

The early part of 2022 was roughly what one would normally expect as far as temperatures and rainfall were concerned; no snow and, unusually, February was warming up a bit.

Whereas March and April are usually very unsettled and quite stormy but, in 2022, there were only 7 days with significant rain in the whole 2-month period and it the warming up process continued.

May continued the upward trend - sunny and increasingly warm and less than average rainfall which continued for much of June with only half the usual rainfall and above average temperatures and sunshine.

Normally monthly measurements only vary by a few tenths but this was to change massively in July and August. Temperatures rose reaching 38.1C (99.9F) on the 19th July (in my garden) and the average maximum for the month was a massive 6.0C above the 30-year average Also I only recorded 1mm of rain in July and that was spread over 3 days (the monthly average is 55mm) - so it was totally ineffective for garden plants and crops. One usually sees the temperatures begin to ease down from mid August but there were 20 days above 25C (the average for the month is 21C) and the average was again 6.0C above the 30-year average.

Fortunately the rains started in September with severe thunderstorms on the morning of the 8th but also 16 dry days in the month. The autumn continued basically warm and with enough rain to enable the hose pipe bans to be cancelled.

So all the first 11 months of 2022 had above average temperatures, sometimes massively so.

But... December started cool and then became seriously cold with my lowest night temperature of minus 8.4C on the 15th and minus 7.5C the next night.

During the period 5pm on the 10th Dec until 10am on the 18th Dec the temperature only rose above freezing between midday and 4pm on the 13th (just 4 hours). Interestingly the ground temperatures were mainly fractionally warmer than the night-time air temperatures due to residual deeper soil temperatures conducting warmth upward.

Then it became quite mild from Christmas to the New Year. The first 12 days of January have been wet - only 1 day with minimal rain (and more to come). My rainfall is currently not far off 3 times the average.


