Silence and spirituality

A few years ago, I went through the ordination process for the Church of England, and I had to prepare a seminar. One of suggested topics was “The spirituality of silence”. Although the title had a nice ring to it, I decided against it. I was glad that I did. As it turned out, two others on the same panel chose a topic related to the theme of silence. I have now been in enough religious circles and seminars to know that silence is often equated with spirituality and spiritual blessing.

I think that most of us will recognise that there is something about silence that seems to be spiritual. The problem with this is that the more we consider spirituality to be something gained from silence, the more impractical spirituality becomes (I write this with a toddler crying in the background). This is where the gospel of Mark has challenged my view of silence and spirituality.

Mark’s gospel is action-packed. There is no time to stop and smell the roses. The writer of Mark’s gospel has an itinerary, and he ushers us readers swiftly from one scene to the next, providing us with just enough detail to understand exactly who Jesus is, and why he has come. In Mark chapter 4 the disciples are on a boat with Jesus. Suddenly, they find themselves being tossed about in a vicious storm. These men are seasoned sailors, accustomed to the rough and tumble of serious waves, and yet as familiar as they are with their environment, they are not comfortable. They are trembling with fear. They believe that their days have come to an end and that this storm is about to swallow them up and send them all to a watery grave. The disciples are confronted with the reality of death in the chaos of a storm.

Where is Jesus in the middle of this chaos? The disciples find Jesus asleep in the stern of the boat. Here is the saviour, the one person they can rely on, and yet in the middle of their greatest fear they find him asleep. The disciples wake Jesus up and ask him a pertinent question. “Jesus! Do you not care that we are perishing?” Well, we all know how the story goes. Jesus gets up. He rebukes the wind and the waves. The storm is calmed. They are all saved from death.

It is then that Jesus asks the disciples an interesting question. “Why are you so afraid? Have you still no faith?” It seems to me that Jesus’s question suggests that true spirituality, or faith, was to be found, expressed and experienced in the chaos of the storm rather than the quiet and calm. Jesus wanted the disciples to trust in him during the storm and in the chaos. It was there in the rough and tumble of life that the disciples needed to remind themselves about the love of God and his commitment to save those who are perishing. It was there while the waves were tossing them about and drenching them with fear that they needed to be reminded that the God who appears to be sleeping is in fact the Lord who holds the whole world in his hands.

The world does seem to be in a bit of chaos at the moment. Watch the news, click away on YouTube, or search for a podcast, and it won’t be long before you’re bombarded with reasons to be fearful and anxious about the future. It might seem like God is sleeping and is unconcerned, but he is calling on us to trust in him, to express a real spirituality, to have faith in his Son.

Some seek for God’s assurance in silence but as I read the gospels it seems to be the case that God is most needed and most available to us in the chaos of life. True spirituality, at least in Mark 4, means trusting in God when things are not so silent.





Veg on the Edge – Cranes Road Allotments, SSJ



The Ash Tree

The most significant recent change to our plot of four allotments has been the removal of the large ash tree during the winter months. This was due to ash dieback, which has affected ash trees across the country. Some of you will certainly remember Dutch Elm disease,

which had such a devastating impact on our landscape. It was sad to see the tree go; it was imposing and provided habitat for so many different species. At least there is now more light flooding in.

Late start and dry April

During March and early April, we had some glorious weather but lots of cold nights, which meant first sowings direct into the ground were late. I don't think any of the first seed sowings have worked, except for the kohlrabi which I am trying for the first time. Now we are having to contend with a sustained dry spell. We have no water supply at Cranes Road and our precious reserves collected over winter are already running low. I am nervously waiting for the first carrot and parsnip seedlings to

emerge! At least we can normally rely on the fruit; rhubarb has already been plentiful and the strawberry plants are looking promising.

No dig

I would like to be able to 'no dig', but find I am unable to generate enough compost for it to work. The winter rains compact my soil, so I feel compelled to dig to loosen up the top layer. For the time being I will use 'no dig' on a couple of raised beds.

A haven I have had several failures and some successes, yet still very much enjoy working the allotment. The surrounding shrubs and trees and birdsong envelop us and create a little haven.

Hospice undertakes critical upgrades to inpatient unit



St. Michael's Hospice will undertake a refurbishment of its Inpatient Unit this summer. The project will see all existing corridor flooring replaced, new lighting and redecoration.

North Hampshire's only adult hospice is celebrating its 30th Anniversary this year. Over these 30 years the requirements governing infection control have been constantly evolving. To bring the Hospice up to date and transform the environment for staff, patients and visitors the carpet, lighting and decoration of the inpatient unit will be replaced.

This refurbishment was planned prior to COVID in 2020 but postponed due to the pressure for beds the virus caused on healthcare system.

These upgrades must now be undertaken as a matter of priority. For the two-week period the refurbishment will take, the Hospice will care for our patients in the community via increasing the workforce capacity of its Hospice at Home team. The safety and comfort of its patients and staff were paramount in making its decision.

Iain Cameron, Chief Executive of St. Michael's said "We have planned this progressive refurbishment with our healthcare partners and have the total support of our staff to ensure that patients will continue to receive the highest standard of round the clock specialist palliative care. We have communicated widely to our supporters and volunteers in the community to explain how the refurbishment will benefit patients and their families. By making these positive building improvements we will dramatically improve the physical working environment for patients and the dedicated teams delivering care to our patients".

Philippa Aslet, Director of Nursing at St. Michael's Hospice is passionate about the transformation process.

"The refurbishment project is an exceptional opportunity to really improve the environment in which patients are cared in. All the teams are very excited and looking forward to seeing the result. For the duration of the refurbishment our clinical staff, who work tirelessly delivering exceptional care to patients on the inpatient unit, will work in support of their community colleagues. This ensures we have the additional capacity required to meet patient needs. In addition, we will continue to provide a 24hr a day phone line manned by specialist clinical staff to provide support to patients and families. Whilst it can sometimes be more challenging delivering care in the community, we are confident that there will be minimal interruption to the support our Hospice provides to the community. At the end of the refurbishment process we will have a hugely improved environment that is easier to maintain, meets the latest infection control requirements yet remains welcoming for patients who visit to receive vital treatment, care and support."

The work will begin on July 1st, and is scheduled to last 14 days.

Prostate Cancer Support Group - Geographic Profiling

With such a vague title, what is that all about? The Support Group was extremely privileged to have Colin Johnson as our speaker at our April meeting. Colin is one of only four with worldwide recognition in this field of forensic investigation, which is proving even more effective than criminal profiling, and he held us mesmerised for well over an hour – normally our speakers get 20 to 30 minutes.

He started by giving some of his background, having worked on four continents over a 20 year period, and has included not only writing books and appearing on TV, but more recently academic teaching.

He went on to highlight the keys to investigations, for example the criminal's maintenance of their routine, normal rational approach, how they work on the 'least effort principle', but

most importantly how they have an anchor point. He then elaborated about anchor points, where typically this is their home, but can also be their place of work or recreation point, explaining that around 50% of these crimes take place within a mile of the anchor point, but always with a buffer zone. What can make this more difficult, is where the criminal is familiar with an area from past association e.g. they used to live locally, or that they perhaps have a local relative which they then visit regularly.

However, he mentioned that the victims' bodies are usually dumped further away, again in an area known to the criminal, but normally never more than 150 yards from a roadway. He also added that the last person claiming to have seen the victim alive is always investigated first, as often they turn out to be a prime suspect.

Colin finished by giving us a detailed run down of the high profile Millie Dowler case and its link to the French student Amelie Delagrangre, and how geographic profiling was able bit by bit to link the locations together, which included both Levi Bellfield's own home address and that of his then girlfriend, as well as dump points for bodies and possessions, which when added to tiny snippets of CCTV evidence of vehicles he used, proved conclusive in his conviction.

Colin not only kindly took informal questions afterwards, but for our group waived his normal speaker's fee, citing relatives who have also had prostate cancer.

WOMEN'S FELLOWSHIP

The Women's Fellowship talk in May was given by Marion Dante, called Dropping the Habit, which members had apparently interpreted in a number of ways.

Marion became a nun at the age of fourteen, in her home town of Limerick. Throughout her early childhood her family and friends told her constantly that she was called by God to save souls, and her mother who suffered from depression, was delighted when she announced that she would be entering the convent.

Just after the second world war Marion and her family moved to England, at the time when the many prejudices included the "No Irish" placards when looking for accommodation. They settled in and around London and Surrey, and Marion went to the Selesian Sisters Convent, founded by her hero John Bosco, whose mission was to save the unfortunate souls on the Great Continents.

Marion described her early years in the Convent with humour, telling us how she and the other novitiates had to make their own habits, how the food was sparse and unappetising - except on Feast Days of course - and how life consisted of housework, silence and prayer.

Marion trained to become a teacher and taught in inner city London schools and the leafy Surrey suburbs, but as the years went by she, and the other postulants began to doubt their calling, their faith and the enclosed convent life. Years earlier she had discovered that she had in fact been conceived out of wedlock (but not born out of wedlock) and she thought this was the prime reason for her mother's depression, which was infused with guilt. Marion was shocked at this revelation and herself suffered a breakdown.

A major factor in Marion's evolving doubts was Pope John xxiii - known as a Good Pope - and who convened

the second Vatican Council which transformed the Catholic Church in theological, practical ways.

By the time she left convent life Marion was 47, having spent 33 years as a nun. This was naturally not an easy decision to make and it took her a long time to take that great step. She had little experience or knowledge of 'normal life' and tasks such as using an ATM, ordering food in a cafe and purchasing food and clothing was a daily chore that had to be learned. She now lives in Surrey and, having been diagnosed with breast cancer, continues to raise money for the Fountains Centre at the Royal Surrey Hospital. She lives a varied life and belongs to a number of groups and organisations, as well as home-tutoring.

Marion was thanked for her brilliant talk by Theresa Kerr.

The next meeting will be on Tuesday 7th June when the talk will be 'Around the World in Forty Years'.

Making life safer for our residents in Hampshire with our Fire Dogs

In 2006 over 50% of fires in the UK were attributed to arson. And yet the arrest rate was only 9%, detection rate only 7% and conviction rate only 3%.

So in 2007 Hampshire Fire & Rescue Service set up the Arson Task Force in collaboration with Hampshire Constabulary. In 2020 the Arson Task Force was hailed as a world leader in arson investigation. In 2021 arrests were 63%, detections 49% and convictions 98% in Hampshire and Isle of Wight. 150 arsonist have been removed from our communities and are serving in excess of 500 years in prison!

Assisting in gaining these remarkable improvements are our four canine detectives, two of whom are pictured here. They are trained to detect the presence of ignitable liquids and can get straight to the seat/cause of a fire, quicker and with much more accuracy than a human being.

It is quite wonderful watching them work, they even have special rubber booties to protect their paws!



LEGAL CORNER



It is a common grumble that conveyancing takes longer than expected. Buyers are keen to own their new properties as soon as possible but the average transaction takes around 12 weeks from offer to completion.

Several factors can contribute to delays:

Identification

Conveyancers are required by law to verify the identity of clients and the source of their funds. Ensure you have ID documents and proof of deposit readily available at the very start of the transaction.

Lost Documents

If you have carried out work on a property you are selling, get planning and building regulation paperwork together. Check you have your Final Certificates. A surprising number of sellers do not

request the building inspector for a final inspection so do not receive their Completion Certificates.

Lost Title Deeds

Although most properties are now registered with the Land Registry some unregistered land remains, particularly where the property has remained in the same family for many years. If you have original deeds, please keep these safe.

Missing Rights

When viewing a property make a point of checking for private access roads and shared driveways, private or shared services such as drainage, and other unusual features.

Service Information Packs

Properties that are leasehold or have an estate service charge require these, and they can take anything between 2 to 8 weeks to be returned by management companies. If your property is subject to a service charge, let your conveyancer know early.

Missing Landlords and Defective Leases

If your property is leasehold or subject to ground rent, ensure you have your latest ground rent receipt or freeholder contact details available.

Finance Problems

Speak to your bank or financial adviser before making an offer. If you are

funding your purchase from savings, check how long it takes to release the funds - a Life Time ISA can take up to 3 weeks to be released. If you are receiving a gifted deposit, you need to provide information on the source of the funds to your conveyancer and mortgage lender, so submit your paperwork early.

Search Delays

Most local authorities can return an Official Local Search within two weeks, but some require longer as not all records are readily available. Further searches may be required in particular circumstances like former mining areas or relative to the particular property such as a Highways Search where there are access issues.

Whilst delays can be frustrating, there may be factors outside of your conveyancer's control. It is important that the documentation is correct and complies with legislation to avoid future problems, so you need to be flexible with target dates and review these regularly as the transaction proceeds.




