Our Summer Show – Saturday 17th August 2024 – 12.30pm

Welcome to the 2024 Summer Show Schedule. Please note this year's date!

For those who don't know, this is the document that sets out the classes you can enter in the Summer Show here in Framfield, Blackboys and Palehouse Common in the summer. The Summer Show is the biggest event in the Parish every year and provides an afternoon of family entertainment on the Recreation Ground and the Memorial Hall in Framfield from 12.30pm. You should keep this schedule if you are thinking of joining in the fun of competing against all those others! The full schedule can be downloaded from www.framfieldandblackboys-hort-soc.com. This version contains a range of advice and guidance on how to compete more successfully including floral arrangements and growing plants.

The date of the show is now going to be the third Saturday in August each year. This is to avoid a clash with events in Uckfield in August.

The centrepiece of the show will remain the marquee with the vegetable, flower and plant exhibits as well as the Memorial Hall where you find the handicraft, cookery and children's exhibits. As usual there will be a central arena with a range of items to enjoy as well as the Scarecrows brought to the show. We hope to have entertainment alongside the bar and refreshment tent and a full range of stalls, many of which are local. There will a range of catering options for you to try out so you don't need to eat before you come along to the Summer Show!

A Plea...

None of this takes place without the Summer Show Committee who meet regularly to ensure we have a successful show. To those dedicated few I have to express my thanks in advance of this year's Summer Show. Also doing their bit are the wonderful volunteers who staff stalls, gates and generally help us do all the things that need doing. We would love you to join the camaraderie of getting the show together on the day before (Friday 16th August). Go on...

People are often a little anxious about actually entering the show. But the helpful hands and guidance from those running the show make for an easy transition from 'never before' to 'novice entrant'. The full downloadable schedule contains a range of advice but you can always contact me if you want to know anything more. Our standards are **NOT** like you see in the Chelsea Flower Show. So don't be frightened, have a go, whether it be in vegetables, flowers or creative. You never know, you might see your name on the Winner's Board later in the afternoon of the show or even go home with one of our treasured trophies!

The profits from the show continue to be split between a Community Fund (see a few pages further on) and the Framfield and Blackboys Horticultural Society (who underwrite the costs of the Summer Show).

Summary Comments for 2024

- The delivered printed schedule is smaller than in previous years to reduce waste. The full schedule is available from www.framfieldandblackboys-hort-soc.com from April.
- As the Summer Show Committee moves towards a more sustainable show, we are trying to reduce and remove unnecessary plastic. This includes *floral foam*. Flower exhibits should now NOT include floral foam (e.g. Oasis).
- Late entries are no longer accepted after the deadline of Wednesday 14th August 2024.
- There are a few new classes in Sections 1, 2 and 3 as well as the annual changes within Sections 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8.

So ensure you keep Saturday 17th August clear in your diary You won't want to miss it!

SECTION 1 - FRUIT & VEGETABLES

This section is open to Adults; Novices & Children. For help phone Terry Everitt on 07592 604703.

- 1. VEGETABLES Best Collection 5 Completely Different Kinds. Displayed in the tray supplied by the society (max size 75cm x 60cm). Only vegetables from classes 6 to 24 plus class 29 may be exhibited. Quantities as specified for the individual classes in Section 1 below. Some combinations not permitted (6/7, 12/13, 16/17 & 20/21).
- 2. THE SOCIETY TRAY- 3 Types of Vegetables displayed for effect on a marked area, black cloth or tray permitted, (maximum size 45cm x 60cm). Three types of vegetables from the following list: Carrots (3); Beetroot (3); Runner beans (6); Potatoes (3); Tomatoes (5); Cauliflower (2); Onions (3). Each type of vegetable will be scored out of 20 points. Display rings may be used and tops may be whipped or tied where appropriate. Parsley may be used to garnish.
- 3. FROM MY GARDEN OR ALLOTMENT (In memory of Maurice Malyon.) A display of 2 types of vegetables (3 of each kind) and a vase of flowers (vase supplied by society) **OR** a dish of fruit. This can be an individual or family entry with points counting towards the Jeffery Victor Ludorum Family Trophy. Prize money does not count towards the Banksian Medal.

Taste Section

- 4. TASTY TOMATO – a class that celebrates TASTE rather than size and shape. 1 tomato, any type.
- 5. CLASSIC CARROT – a class celebrating the true TASTE of carrots. 1 carrot, any type, scrubbed.

- 7. POTATOES - coloured (5)
- BEETROOTS globe stems trimmed to 8. 7.5cm approx. (Tving optional.) (3)

- 11. LETTUCES - any one variety (2)
- 12. ONIONS – under 250g (5) (Tops tied)

- SHALLOTS Pickling, small not to exceed 16. 3cm diameter (Tops tied.) (12)

- 20. TOMATOES – cherry (10) (up to 3cm)

- TOMATOES any variety (excluding cherry 21. or beefsteak) (6)
- 22. COURGETTES – approx 15cm (3)
- 23. FRENCH BEANS (9)
- 24. CHILLI PEPPERS (5) (ripeness not essential)
- 25. COLLECTION OF CULINARY HERBS in a glass iar
- 26. LONGEST RUNNER BEAN
- 27. A BOWL OF SEASONAL FRUIT
- 28. AN AMUSINGLY DECORATED VEGETABLE
- 29. ANY OTHER VEGETABLE OR FRUIT - see note below for quantities required

Making a Floral Exhibit – Guidance

Daunting as it may seem – and when you see those finished floral arrangements, even more daunting! – with a few tips and tricks everyone can have a go!

So we asked Framfield and Blackboys Horticultural Society Committee member and experienced flower arranger Margaret for some guidance about staging an exhibit.

Firstly, Margaret said don't be too ambitious

- Floral exhibits take time to produce on the day. One or two arrangements is a good first time entry.
- Give yourself plenty of time. This is more important if you are staging other exhibits in the show such as vegetables or handicrafts.
- An exhibit is composed of natural plant material (gathered or bought) that may be with or without non-plant accessories contained within a specified area.
- Ensure your arrangement is completed by 9.45am.

Things to be aware of when staging an exhibit

If you are not according to the schedule you might lose out with all your efforts by being exactly that! "Not According to Schedule".

- Read the schedule document. Take note of sizes and requirements.
- Do not be wider than stated in any way.
- Do not include non-plant items that are not permitted. You can always ask!
- Ensure every single living plant has access to water while in the arrangement via cut stems
 or its roots.
- We have stipulated that floral foam is no longer allowed in the Framfield & Blackboys
 Summer Show when staging an exhibit. There is further advice on this aspect on the page titled "Putting The Green Into Our Summer Show".
- Avoid artificial plant material unless specifically allowed.

Good Practice and Etiquette

Having read the schedule and had your ideas, you have your plants and staging materials ready...

- Plan your exhibit and pre-make any staging you can.
- Arrive in good time and select an area on the tables outside the marquee to prepare on.
- Take care not to hamper others using the tables to prepare their exhibits.
- Ensure there is sufficient water (available from the big bins by the door) to keep your plant material in good condition.
- Check, and check again that you are not wider than the space allowed in this schedule.
- Place your card proudly down with your details NOT visible.
- Tidy up your work area.

• Enjoy chatting to others!

We hope you might have a go at one or two of the classes on the 17th August. See you there!





SECTION 3 – NOVICE VEGETABLE, FRUIT, FLOWER & PLANTS

All classes eligible for Junior Award Of Merit (up to and including 16 years).

The Novice Section is for those with less experience and the classes are deliberately set to be easier.

The judging is also more forgiving!

A novice is an exhibitor who has not won more than three first prizes in Section 3 in Past Shows. A novice may also enter any other classes in Section 1, 2, 4 & 5.

Exhibitors can seek help from the Stewards when staging exhibits.

SECTION 4 - FLORAL ARRANGEMENTS

No floral foam is permitted to be included in any exhibit.

82. "5 BOTTLES" – an exhibit of fresh flowers displayed in 5 bottles of different heights.

How To Enter for Exhibition

"We would encourage you to have a go" has to be the guiding principle of our entire 124 classes of entry. In some classes that is enough to actually win! The other way of looking at it is that the entry standard may not be as high as you think! Worth a go surely!

Section One of the 8 broad types of exhibits.

Class One of the sub-sections within a section with a specification or number required.

Novice Anyone who has not won more than THREE first prizes anywhere in the UK. We cannot check this; you just have to be honest! A Novice can enter any Class where their age permits them.

The standard is set to be easier to reach in Novice Classes.

Children There are 124 children's classes! But some classes are children only. In other words, a child

can enter any class in the show for free! There is a specific children's section. Other children's classes are throughout the schedule in Sections 2, 4, 5, 7 & 8. Age ranges define

who can enter a particular children's class.

Entry Cards Collected from the door of the marquee on the Recreation Ground and to be put with your

exhibit, name side down. Use one of our RED DOTS to get your exhibit back.

Collections Groups of exhibits in the vegetable section. These usually attract a higher cash prize. There

are five in Section 1 (Classes 1, 2, 3, 31 & 32) and a Novice Plate of Produce (Class 61) that we encourage you to enter. The Novice Plate of Produce is relatively new and will likely not have

many entries, so you have a good chance of winning!

Put simply the guidance is as follows.

- YOU OR YOUR IMMEDIATE FAMILY must have grown the produce or made the item entered
 yourself. Anything else is just unfair, a shame and a fraudulent entry. However, in the flower
 arranging classes you can buy the blooms to use to create your display.
- Read the schedule for the number of items needed and other notes about the class.
- You can only make ONE entry per class. There are 124 to choose from, surely that's enough!
- Presentation and staging are crucial. Make it look good! However, don't let this put you off from entering, as the standard is often quite variable.
- Vegetables should be washed and cleaned carefully with a damp sponge or soft cloth and then trimmed (and tied if asked to be).
- Flowers should be insect free and as perfect as possible. Not all buds have to be open on a multi-bloom stem.



- Appearance, freshness and being the same sizes are the judging criteria for fruit, vegetables and flowers BUT do not worry about it too much, it isn't Chelsea!
- If in doubt, contact Terry Everitt prior to the show on 07592 604703 or on terry.everitt@outlook.com or ask our friendly stewards by the door on the actual day of the Summer Show who will answer your query or point you towards someone who can help.

Further more specific advice can be found elsewhere in the schedule.

The Framfield & Blackboys Horticultural Society do sometimes run Talks and Workshops during the year about exhibiting vegetables, fruit and flowers as well as flower arranging.

So why not join the Framfield and Blackboys Horticultural Society. All talks are free to members and we also run trips to gardens (some guided) and workshops, often at discounted rates for members.

Guidance & Specific Notes for Exhibitors

<u>PLEASE NOTE:</u> You or your immediate family <u>MUST</u> have grown or created the exhibit yourself. Anything else is just unfair, a shame and a fraudulent entry. This does not apply to flower arranging classes where you can buy the blooms to display.

TIMINGS

- Sections 1–4 exhibits in the marquee 6.00am.
- Exhibits in the Memorial Hall from 8.00am. Sections 5 to 8.
- There are **NO LATE ENTRIES** on the day of the show.
- All exhibits must be in place **before** 9.45am to enable efficient judging.

AM I A NOVICE or NOT?

- A Novice has won not more than 3 First Prizes in any one show anywhere in the UK.
- A novice can enter ANY class in any Section (subject to age on children's classes) as well as anything
 indicated as a Novice Entry.

STAGING & ENTERING

- Exhibits should be displayed for maximum visual effect.
- Certain exhibits must be displayed within their specified area.
- Only **ONE** exhibit may be entered by each exhibitor in each of the 124 classes.
- Exhibits are judged on freshness & uniformity (colour & size). Match items as near as possible.
- When washing vegetables use a soft sponge or cloth to prevent damaging skins.

VEGETABLES

- Carrots, beetroot & parsnip to have foliage trimmed back to 7.5cm with tapering roots intact.
- Onions & shallots are best exhibited with roots trimmed & tops neatly tied/whipped. Rub off outer damaged skin only and dry to a brown colour. Exhibit in sand (supplied if needed) on the plate.
- Peas & beans must be displayed with some stalk and be full pods.
- Runner beans should be as straight as possible plus with a uniformity of length & tenderness.
- Cucumbers, courgettes & squashes may be displayed with or without flowers.
- Lettuce is best exhibited clean with the roots washed and wrapped in cling film.
- Tomatoes are exhibited with fresh stalk attached & fruits should be red and unblemished.
- For the purposes of judging it may be required to break open an item within an entry.

FLOWERS

- Flowers should be fresh, as free as possible from insect attack and good quality.
- Pot plants should be displayed in clean pots with dead leaves removed.
- Vases will be supplied by the society.

FRUIT

- Fruit should be exhibited with the stalks and eyes attached.
- Judges may handle exhibits, open pods etc. to check the quality.

FLORAL ARRANGEMENTS

- Classes will be judged by NAFAS Competitions Manual 3rd Edition 2015.
- We are discouraging the use of floral foam. (See a few pages further on in this schedule.)
- Containers needed for the exhibit to be supplied by the entrant.
- Staging will be provided by the Show Organisers.
- An exhibit is composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories, in the space set.
- Backgrounds, bases, containers, drapes, exhibit titles and mechanics may always be included in an
 exhibit, unless otherwise stated. In all exhibits natural plant material must predominate.
- All classes will be staged on open tabling. Tables will be covered in Hessian.

Putting The Green Into Our Summer Show

Over the last couple of years, the Summer Show Committee have been making steps towards reducing the environmental impact of the Summer Show.

This has taken place in a number of ways. Some aspects of the show have always been environmentally sustainable in that we consistently reuse as much material that is used to put on the Summer Show from year to year. However, since 2019 we have made a deliberate decision to increase our efforts.

At the Summer Show, the organising Committee now use...

- No plastic containers
- Sustainable cutlery
- Increasing use of compostable materials in the refreshment tent
- Recycled and recyclable materials

We are working to spread this message among our stallholders and caterers.

Floral Foam

One area we would like to move forwards with is the elimination of non-biodegradable and non-recyclable floral foam. This is in line with NAFAS and the RHS.

We therefore no longer allow exhibits to use floral foam.

So what can you do instead? (Do more than one of these in combination if needed.)

Pin holders These are reusable plates with closely spaced pins to hold

flower stems in place.

Chicken wire A cage or ball inside a container that stems are inserted

into, but be careful not to cut yourself!

An old flower frog These are glass inserts for vases with holes in.

Pebbles, sand, gravel & marbles Used in a container to about a 1/3 depth that you can then

push your stems into.

Shredded wood Sometimes called wood aspen or excelsior, this is a

compostable material that is a tangle of fibres.

Pliable twigs Twigs such as curly willow pushed inside a vase as a

support for stems.

We hope you will support us in our intention to decrease our environmental footprint.

Maybe even leave the car at home if you can and wander up to the Summer Show.

Advice on Growing and Preparing for the Show

The Summer Show is on the 17th of August in 2024.

If you wish to exhibit vegetables and fruit in the show then you can just plant when you have the time and see what there is ready near the time.

However, with a little forethought you can have more choices ready.

Planting Calendar:

Crop	When to plant	Time to grow	Comment
Tomato	March	Over 15 weeks	Use a propagator to start
Potato	April	Up to 20 weeks	Leave unplanted exposed to light from Feb
Onion	March for sets	Over 12 weeks	Takes 3 weeks to dry skins
Beetroot	March onward	7 to 12 weeks	
Radish	From March	4 to 6 weeks	
Peas	May	10 weeks	
Courgettes	April	8 to 12 weeks	Protect from frost
Cucumber	From February	Over 10 weeks	Use a propagator to start
Sweetcorn	Late April	15 weeks	
Runner Beans	From April	14 to 16 weeks	
French Beans	From April	10 to 12 weeks	
Carrots	March	Over 18 weeks	
Chilli Peppers	February	Over 17 weeks	Use a propagator or indoors
Lettuces	April	10 weeks	

This is of course affected by...

- Weather (especially frost) but also heat and lack of rain
- Water levels (dry conditions hold back crops massively!)
- Sunlight is better than shade for vegetable growing
- Soil fertility
- Variety of seed chosen
- How close together and weed level

Seeds come in quite large numbers in packets. However, you do have to be quite mercenary in thinning out to give the plant spacing needed for full size growth. Use the packet instructions for guidance.

There are of course endless other tips on growing successfully but you have to just give it a try at the start!

When it comes to exhibiting, it isn't really that difficult. Just make everything clean and look the same size in the numbers stated in our schedule.


