

NOTICE OF MEETING TO VOTE ON TAX RATE

A tax rate of \$0.633999 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of City of Queen City.

PROPOSED TAX RATE	\$0.633999 per \$100
NO-NEW-REVENUE TAX RATE	\$0.667238 per \$100
VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE	\$0.655905 per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2026 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for City of Queen City from the same properties in both the 2025 tax year and the 2026 tax year.

The voter-approval rate is the highest tax rate that City of Queen City may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that City of Queen City is not proposing to increase property taxes for the 2026 tax year.

A PUBLIC MEETING TO VOTE ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON September 10, 2026 AT 5:45 pm AT Queen City City Hall, 601 Loop 236, Queen City, TX 75572.

The proposed tax rate is also not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, City of Queen City is not required to hold an election to seek voter approval of the rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the Angela Young Cass County Tax Assessor-Collector of City of Queen City at their offices or by attending the public meeting mentioned above.

The 86th Texas Legislature modified the manner in which the voter-approval tax rate is calculated to limit the rate of growth of property taxes in the state.

The following table compares the taxes imposed on the average residence homestead by City of Queen City last year to the taxes proposed to be imposed on the average residence homestead by City of Queen City this year.

Average homestead taxable value	\$132,269	\$141,399	increase of 6.90%

Total tax levy on all properties	\$625,321	\$582,940	decrease of \$-42,381, or -6.78%
