"Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth; break forth into joyous song and sing praises!" Psalm 98:4

The hymn that comes to mind for me this December is "Joy to the World!" Why that hymn, you ask?

Well, the phrase, "Joy to the World" expresses the profound joy that comes from the birth of Christ. This is not just a momentary feeling but a deep-seated promise of salvation and hope. It serves as a reminder that joy is a gift from God, meant to be shared and celebrated. As believers, we are called to reflect this joy in our lives and spread it to others, being an example of the love and grace that Christ brings to the world.

Joy to the World, the Lord is Come.
Let earth receive her king.
Let every heart prepare Him room
And heaven and nature sing (repeat)
And heaven and heaven and nature sing.

No more let sins and sorrows grow, Nor thorns infest the ground; He comes to make His blessings flow, Far as the curse is found (repeat) Far as, far as the curse is found. Joy to the earth the Savior reigns Let men their songs employ; While fields and floods, rocks hills and plains, Repeat the sounding joy (repeat) Repeat, repeat the sounding joy!

He rules the world with truth and grace, And makes the nations prove The glories of His righteousness And wonders of His love (repeat) And wonders, wonders of His love.

You may be surprised by the history of this hymn! While most Christmas carols focus on the story of the nativity in the <u>past</u>, "Joy to the World" actually encourages Christians to look forward to the future. Claire Pfann, Academic Dean at University of the Holy Land, says, "There is one Christmas carol that is unlike all others, having to do with the coming of Jesus. 'Joy to the World' is not about the First Coming of Jesus, but about the <u>Second</u> Coming of Jesus." It is about when He comes again, finally, and rules in power, justice and mercy."

This hymn was originally part of a book of poems written by the great English hymn writer, Isaac Watts, in 1719. Based on the 98th Psalm, the poem was never intended to be a Christmas song... or any kind of song, for that matter. And Watts never knew that he had just written one of his most famous hymns.

A century later a Boston music teacher named Lowell Mason discovered the poem and set it to music. Because it was released at Christmastime, it quickly became a holiday favorite and went on to become the most published Christmas carol in America.

What brings you joy at this time of year? I get great joy from the worship music at Christmastime, and the chance to reflect on the great and wonderful gift God gave us in His Son, Jesus Christ. Because of His sacrifice, my sins are washed away by His blood, and I am once again restored into a close relationship with God the Father. You can have that joy, too!! Give your heart, mind and life to Jesus Christ and you, too, will be singing, "Joy to the World."

MISSION The Barnabus Fund is named after Barnabus of the New Testament, His name meant "son of encouragement." He was a man of wealth who sold property and gave the proceeds to the apostles for relief of needy members in the church (Acts 4:32-37) The Barnabus Fund is available to assist members of Albion Lutheran Church facing financial hardship. No one individual or family should receive more than 10% of the balance of funds in the account unless approved by the Albion Church Council. The aim of the Fund is to provide people with emergency aid/short term assistance as a bridge to financial stability. The Barnabus Fund is administered by a member of the Church Council and is advised by Albion's Pastor.

EXAMPLES A few examples of assistance provided by the Barnabus Fund are:

- •Financial assistance for an unemployed Albion Church member in need of medical care, travel for a family medical emergency, car repair, housing, utilities, groceries, etc.
- •Financial support to share the cost of counseling for an Albion individual or couple.
- •Payment of childcare and insurance for a single parent while looking for employment.

COUNSELING: Applicants to the Barnabus Fund are supported in prayer, friendship, spiritual counsel and whatever additional assistance is needed in the situation. The Fund is a tangible expression of Christ's love.

CONFIDENTIALITY: The Barnubus Committee will handle all requests in the strictest of confidence.

FUNDING: The Barnabus Fund is supported solely by financial contributions from Albion Church members.

Financial hardships do occur within our church family; the Barnabus Fund seeks to ensure that they are not overlooked. As Barnabus of old, we extend help and encouragement to those in need. Assistance given by the Fund is considered a gift.

Anyone wishing to contribute to the Barnabus Fund can make a check out to Albion Lutheran Church and indicate Barnabus Fund on the memo line. The Barnabus Fund has also been chosen to be the Mission Giving for the month of December.
