

VILLAGE OF MESICK
WATER RATES AND FEES
RESOLUTION 2025-04

WHEREAS, the Village of Mesick adopted Resolution 2021-02 on May 12, 2021.

WHEREAS, the Village of Mesick Water Ordinance authorizes water fee by Resolution.

And

WHEREAS, the Village of Mesick desires to amend Resolution 2021-02 to Reaffirm the rate increases made by motion April 10, 2024;

Now, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Resolution 2021-02 is hereby amended to read in its entirety as follows:

Recitals

- A. The Village of Mesick currently operates a water distribution system to serve the water needs of the Village.
- B. The Village has been approved for a loan through USDA for the maintenance and expansion of its current water system (Project).
- C. To finance the Project, the Village of Mesick will sell revenue bonds in accordance with the regulations of USDA requirements.
- D. To provide the revenue needed to repay the bonds (both principal and interest) and to provide the revenue needed to operate, maintain, and repair the water system; water user fees and charges are necessary.

Resolution

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that pursuant to the Village of Mesick Water Ordinance, the Village Council hereby establishes the following rates and fees for water services connected to the Mesick water system:

WATER RATES AND FEES

- a. Meter Fee-\$25.00 per month

Larger Meters will be prorated accordingly

- b. Usage Fee-\$3.50 per 1,000 gallons in addition to the Meter Fee.

Miscellaneous Fees

- a. Every water user who connects to the Village water system shall pay a meter installation fee as follows:

Residential: Meter Horn	Greater of \$50.00 or actual cost
Meter (typically 5/8")	Greater of \$210.00 or actual cost
MXU	Greater of \$170.00 or actual cost
Vault	Greater of \$80.00 or actual cost
Commercial: Actual Cost	
Industrial: Actual Cost	

All other costs related to connections shall be paid by the user. Any connection or other repairs to the water service equipment performed by the Village shall be charged at the Village's actual fees for time and materials.

- b. Users requesting the Village to turn on their Village Water Service (other than initial connection) shall pay the Village \$30.00 for each request; except that after work hours, or on weekends and holidays, they shall pay \$150.00
- c. Water Service application fee shall be \$50.00
- d. If the Village does not receive payment for water charges as of the due date of the bill, a late fee of 5% of the total water charges shall be imposed and shall be payable to the village immediately.
- e. Water service turned off for nonpayment will be assessed a fee of \$60.00. Once the fee is assessed, the account must be brought current with payment of cash or money order, or a credit card was successfully processed.

- f. If a check or credit card is presented for payment of a shutoff notice, and the check is deemed un-cashable by the bank, or the credit card is denied, the water will be shut off immediately until the account is brought current with payment of cash or money order, or a credit card successfully processed.
- g. If a check is presented for payment of water/sewer services and is sent back by the bank as un-cashable, the check writer will be given seven (7) days to make the check good in cash or money order or credit card. If the check has not been made good by the seven (7) days, the water/sewer service to the property will be shut off until such time as the monies are received to pay the account in full. Any check returned NSF shall be assessed \$40.00 which will be added to the account. Additionally, the shut off fee will be assessed to the account, on top of the check return fee.
- h. The charge for an area maintenance meter shall be at the current cost paid by the Village for the meter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall become effective the day following its publication in newspaper of general circulation within the Village.
