## RULES & REGULATIONS

Fill out a TICKET and take part in MONEY TREE 50/50 FUNdraiser Draw!

By playing your TOONIE every week you are helping the GDRC, as well as the Home and School Association raise funds for recreation programming projects to maintain and modernize our facilities.

Here's how to participate in our weekly 50/50 draw:

**Step 1:** Ask the GDRC staff or Home and School Association volunteers for a ticket OR fill out the MONEY TREE ticket at any MONEY TREE box location including: the Gagetown Community Recreation Centre, the Apple Tree Market, the Village of Gagetown Municipal office, the Orchard View Nursing Home, the Shell (Upper Gagetown), and the Gagetown School. Fill out the ticket to receive a MONEY TREE number. The number on the ticket is your PERMANENT number.

**Step 2:** Insert your completed portion of the ticket in the slot on the MONEY TREE box.

**Step 3:** Take the sticker supplied, put it on your TOONIE, write your number on the TOONIE and insert it into the MONEY TREE box.

**Step 4:** Play every week, so that you always have a chance to win.

- NB residents over the age of 18 are eligible to play.
- Players must have paid their funds for that week in order to be considered for the draw and for them to be declared a winner.
- Players may obtain a ticket at any of our box locations. Players fill out the ticket to receive their permanent MONEY TREE number and place half of the ticket in the box. To be in the draw players must legibly print their assigned MONEY TREE number on a provided sticker, place the sticker on a toonie and drop it into our MONEY TREE box at one of our 8 box locations by the end of day on Wednesday. MONEY TREE boxes will be collected on Thursday mornings (times may vary due to weather). The draw will be every Thursday @ 6:30pm. This ticket number will be placed in a draw bin located at the Gagetown Community Recreation Centre. It remains in the bin until such time that the number is retired. Each week one number from the draw bin will be drawn.
- Print your number legibly and underline it. (they look different upside down) If we are unable to interpret the number it will be recorded as illegible and therefore not eligible for the draw.
- They can also call Alyssa Shupe @ (506)262-0291, Jennifer Ball @ (506)261-3247 or Frannie Piper @ (506)461-8462 to sign up over the phone.
- Prepayments can be made via by cheque to: 38 Mill Road, Village of Gagetown, NB E5M 1C1 or in person with any GDRC staff or Home and School volunteer coordinator in amounts of \$20, \$52 (6 months) or \$104 (full year).
- Your tag will remain in the draw container for the duration of the draw (continuation).
- You can join the MONEY TREE draw anytime during the duration of the draw.
- If a box is stolen or compromised on a draw week there would be no fair way to confirm if a player had played that week or not. Therefore, we would proceed that week as if it were a non-winner. All other funds collected that week would be carried forward to the next week's total pot.
- You can buy more than one MONEY TREE number (for each number played a separate ticket will need to be completed).
- Winners will be contacted by phone and/or email and published on the GDRC website @ [www.vgdr.com](http://www.vgdr.com) and GDRC FB Page, as well as the Home and School Association FB Page.
- If your number is drawn, and you did not play that week, your half of the jackpot will carry over to the following weekly draw.
- A prepayment list, winners list, rules and information will be located on our website at [www.vgdr.com](http://www.vgdr.com).
- All proceeds from the draw will be used for GDRC programming including: softball field upgrading, outdoor rink repairs and the rebuilding of a sports field complex. The Home and School Association funds will be allocated to field trips, dances and school events.
