Special Report to the General Assembly on recent developments in Poland

23rd February

The Polish Ambassador reported to the United Nations highly increased political tensions and instability after former prime minister Mateusz Morawiecki was assassinated at a support rally this morning. The identity and motive of the assassin is currently unclear, however, violence erupted across the country just hours after the news broke.

23rd February

Reports from reliable sources have uncovered that the assassination was carried out with the intention of rioting far-right groups and inciting further division within Poland after the recent loss of control of government by the late former Prime Minister. Online leaks, verified by UN experts have determined that this was carried out with the support of certain Russian officials and widespread violence continues across the volatile country with the country's military on high alert.

24th February

The UN received reports this morning of the division of Poland by violent far-right and neo-fascist actors with acts of terror and vandalism of government property. Propaganda and disinformation have flooded the population and experts have stated that Poland seems on the brink of collapse after the occurrence of these events.

Along with this report the Secretary General has approved the immediate creation of a Crisis Committee which is directed to preserve the peace in Poland.
