March is here already! Many of you will be leaving at the end of this month, so we have a few reminders in this newsletter on things to check before you leave.

We will continue to hold outdoor events during the month of March and will be holding two Pub Picnics again to accommodate everyone who wishes to attend. Remember we post events on our website under the tabs "Today at RCR" and "Upcoming Events". If you want to stay in touch with goings on in the park, you can check our website, our Facebook page, or receive blast emails during the summer.

If you are planning improvements on your site or park model, be sure to get them pre-approved before you start work. You can start scheduling work for April. We thank you for holding off on doing improvements for these past three months. It made the season much more pleasant for your neighbors.

It can take up to two weeks for that process to stop, and we will forward (first class mail only) mail and packages to you.

This past 12 months has surely been interesting, but I think working around the COVID restrictions has caused us to explore some new things, and some new ways of doing things in the park, and that will just enrich the experience as we go forward.

We do not know as yet if we will be having a Concert series next year, but if it is a go, we will sell tickets in the late fall, and you will be able to purchase them even if you are not here on property.

Water shut offs to park models: We will not be shutting off water at the posts this year. If you wish to shut the water off to your park model, you should have a shutoff installed at your site. We recommend you install it in a place out of the sunlight, use a brass ball valve, and take the handle off when you leave for the summer, so no one can turn it on while you are not there.

Leave your place storm ready: Make sure that any items that might fly are stowed away safely inside your park model. This includes hanging plants, yard art, chairs, and bicycles. If you cover a car or a golf cart with a tarp , please understand that gallon bottles of water will not keep the cover on through the summer thunderstorms let alone a big storm. If you have a Plastic/Rubbermaid type shed, you might want to put a bungee cord or tie a rope around it. Those doors will fly off if the wind hits them just right. We highly recommend you hire a house watcher who can check your place regularly. We have a list of those who provide this service in the office. If your AC goes off, your get a leak in the roof, etc., and it is not caught right away, you could have a serious mold problem by the time you come back.

Remember that we will mow your lawn and weed whack while you are gone, but we do not take care of your planting beds, so if the weeds get unsightly, I will be emailing you!

Mail Processing: We will have you fill out a forwarding form for us before you leave to make sure we have the correct address to forward your mail. First class mail gets forwarded as do packages. We will typically forward your mail for 30 days after you leave. If you are a full time RV'er who will not have a fixed address this summer, let us know and we will accommodate you. Make sure you take the forwarding off your mail at home as soon as you get there, or the mail goes in a never-ending loop from there to here and back again.

Renting your place over the summer: If you rent your place out during the time you are not here, please make sure that they check in when they get here. We need to know who is here.

Kayak Storage: If you are leaving the property until next season, please take your kayaks off the racks and put on your site next to your park model, or better yet, inside your lanai. We use those racks for our summer RV'ers and we don't want to have to worry about them in a storm.

Staying in contact while you are gone: If you are not getting my blast emails and want to get the summer updates, make sure your email is on your forwarding form and I will add you to the list. Also, it is good to read the newsletter when you have a chance. You can contact me directly at any time at Royalcoachman_mgr@Equitylifestyle.com.

Do you know how cool your hearing aids are? I mean really, really cool.

This is the coolest gadget you can wear. It not only helps you listen to the people in your life, it also listens for you. It hears the hum of the AC in your car and softens this noise. It listens for the wind and takes that noise away. It listens for voices and amplifies them, so you hear the people around you.

The new "smart" hearing aids determine sound quality in the room you are in and provide automatic adjustments. If you are in a small room and adjust the volume for louder sound, your hearing aid will remember this. After a few times of this same action on your part, your hearing aid will automatically provide sounds at the louder volume in these settings.

Imagine you drive to our office to see Blair. While you are in your car, your hearing aid is using a program to soften mechanical sounds and amplify voices. As you step out of your car and the wind tousled your shirt, your hearing switched to a program that softened the noise from the wind. Then when you entered our office and the doorbell dinged, your hearing aids changed into its primary program and began looking for voices to amplify.

When you walk down the hallway and step into Blair's office, your hearing aid switches again to decrease any echo sounds that occur in smaller areas. As I mentioned in the beginning of this article, if you repeatedly upped the volume in smaller areas, your hearing aid will automatically increase the volume to your preference.

Overtime, this hearing aid learns what you prefer in different settings and will help you hear without having to fiddle with buttons.

This little device that hangs on your ear all day listens intently, to give you the sounds you want and squash the sounds you don't want, so you hear clearly in conversations.

Thanks to all Board members for volunteering their time and efforts. Thanks also to those who attended the annual meeting in January. Lots of information was shared and we are always open to suggestions.



In January 2001 former resident Hal Scott started the first RCR Senior Games. He had been active in senior games in Illinois for several years. What started as one person's idea with eleven events over five days has become a multi week effort with 46 events ranging from badminton to whiffle ball toss. Participants are separated into four age groups; 50s, 60s, 70s and 80+ and any participant can register for as many events as they like.

The current RCR Senior Games occur every February starting with pickleball and golf, followed by tennis and horseshoes during week 2. 

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
