## Policy Highlight...

### ACCIDENTS/INCIDENTS

The staff makes every effort to ensure the safety of your child. Unfortunately, accidents do occur. When an accident or injury occurs, the center will provide you with a written report for each occurrence, including detailed information about what happened, and any first aid treatment rendered. If it becomes necessary to take the child to the hospital, the instructions outlined on the children's application will be followed. In the event that there is an injury to occur, and notification has not been provided, please contact management. We will address all matters and ensure that appropriate measures are being followed and implement protocols to assist in preventing such injury.

If your child happens to be injured by another child, we ask you to please respect the child's privacy by not asking us to reveal the name of the child. It is never appropriate for a parent to confront another child regarding his or her behavior. All concerns should be brought to the attention of the teacher or Director.

Children ages 1 to 4 have the highest rates of drowning, and drowning dangers aren't just limited to recreational swimming areas like pools, lakes, and rivers. Drowning can happen in less than 2 inches of water, and when babies drown, it most commonly happens in bathtubs, buckets, and toilets. Drowning is silent and can happen in seconds.
