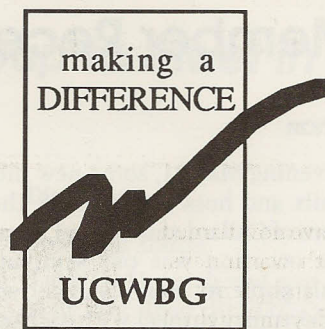

New Member Reception a Success

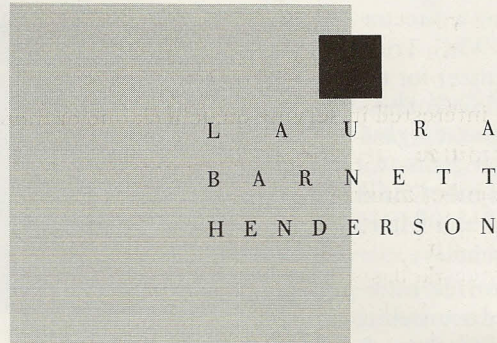

Board Offices

President-Elect

Serves on the advisory board committee, chairs the Leadership Forum, and assists the president and immediate past president with any current or upcoming projects or activities. She also begins to formulate her goals and objectives for the next fiscal year, while fostering communications with the GSB, alumni office, and student groups.

Vice President-Finance

Keeps full and accurate account of re-

ceipts and disbursements of the group. Prepares the annual budget. Prepares monthly financial status reports and analyses as needed.

Vice President-Administration

Serves as secretary of the board of directors, taking accurate minutes of all board meetings. Custodian of all records and reports. Prepares and mails ballots. Prepares updates of by-laws as needed. Coordinates and oversees activities of our contract management services.

Vice President-Internal Communications

Forms and manages a committee that produces and distributes *The Exponent*. Coordinates publication of all other information communicated to the membership as needed. Arranges for written coverage of UCWBG programs and events. Effectively works with everyone on the board, as well as with her own committee, to produce a very tangible and visible product.

Vice President-Programs

Conceptualizes and produces programs and events with the help of a diverse committee. Has the opportunity to personally meet speakers and presenters who are well-respected in their fields. Stays in tune with the wishes and needs of members.

Vice President-Career Management

Works through a committee that seeks new and creative ways to address the career needs of members. Activities may take the form of programs or workshops; recently they have paved new ground: career management roundtables with the Chicago GSB Club and the XP Club; MBA Moms.

Vice President-Marketing

This relatively new board position was created to work with and through other board offices to position the UCWBG as the premier women's professional alumnae organization of The University of Chicago. She and her committee make recommendations to the board regarding recruitment strategies and promotional efforts, and conduct periodic surveys of the membership.

Vice President-Membership

Forms and manages a committee whose primary objectives are organizing and conducting an annual membership drive and producing the directory. She works closely with the VP-Administration to maintain up-to-date membership files and mailing lists.

Vice President-Public Relations

Coordinates external publicity for the group. Arranges photographic coverage of UCWBG programs and events. Establishes on-going relations with business editors and writers. Works closely with the VP-Marketing to increase the visibility of the UCWBG with its various publics.

Directors-At-Large

Currently there are two director-at-large positions on the board. These officers coordinate special programs and activities as requested by the president; e.g., the annual membership telemarketing campaign, new member brunches. Assist other board members in promoting activities. An important function has become "hospitality," or greeting new attendees at events. ♪

Entrepreneurship Group Launches New Activities

As many of you know, there are several subgroups within the UCWBG. These include the North/Northwest group, the Moms with MBAs, and the Entrepreneurship Committee, which is highlighted here.

The Entrepreneurship Committee started as a group of women within the UCWBG who were interested in starting new businesses or were currently running a small business. It is a support group to critique each others' business plans and marketing materials, as well as informally discuss issues surrounding starting and managing small businesses. Activities have expanded to include outside speakers on appropriate topics.

During the first half of the year Judy Thornber organized many interesting speakers for these meetings. Susan Larson spoke about how she researched opportunities and eventually purchased her current company, House-O-Lite. The director of the Women's Business Development Center, Hady Ratner, spoke about

the many aspects of starting a business and some of the resources available to women business owners. The Women's Business Development Center is a non-profit organization which provides consulting to women in small businesses. Finally, in May, two small business bankers, Judy Devovo, vice-president at Harris Trust, and Teresa Handley, vice-president at The Northern Trust Company, discussed how small business owners can work effectively with the banks. The plan for the next meeting is to have a marketing consultant evaluate the members' marketing materials, such as brochures, business cards, and letters.

The meetings are held at Judy's home in downtown Chicago, usually on weekday evenings. Buffet dinners are served at a cost of \$6 per person.

On Tuesday, March 17, the North Shore Mothers' Network (aka Moms with MBAs) met at Joan Sherman's house in Wilmette. Andrea Meltzer of Executive Options was the guest speaker. Executive Options is a placement firm which specializes in "flexible staffing options;" i.e., part-time and project work. Andrea is co-owner of the business with Kay Gurtin, having bought out the interests of one of the original two partners. She is also a U of C Business School graduate and a member of UCWBG. Her presentation was both interesting and eye-opening, since most of the attendees had little familiarity with the broad range of flexible options available. Among the surprising statistics are that 70% of their database of resumes are male candidates, many of whom took early retirement but still like to keep their hands in the business world. Also, the majority of their placements are for "projects," rather than for part-time work. Clients in manufacturing have actually been more open to flexible arrangements for professionals

because they want to attract more female candidates, but fail to do so in their full-time positions. If you are interested in learning more about placement options through Executive Options, call Andrea Meltzer at 312/751-5413.

The Mothers' Network meets in the northern suburbs at irregular intervals. Occasionally, we have guest speakers; other meetings are devoted strictly to socializing.
