POINT 1— A FATHER WHO WAS INTENTIONAL IN PRAYER (JOB 1:5)

Job did not wait for a crisis to pray for his children. He prayed proactively and regularly — *“This was his regular custom.”*



He rose early in the morning — prayer was his first priority, not an afterthought



He offered a sacrifice for each of them individually — he did not pray for his children as a group in passing; each child mattered personally



He prayed in anticipation of sins they might have committed —



POINT 2 – A FATHER WHO UNDERSTOOD SPIRITUAL VULNERABILITY (JOB 1:5)

Job's prayer was rooted in a sober awareness:
*“Perhaps my children have sinned
and cursed God in their hearts.”*

This reveals that Job:



Understood his children were spiritually vulnerable, even during times of joy and celebration

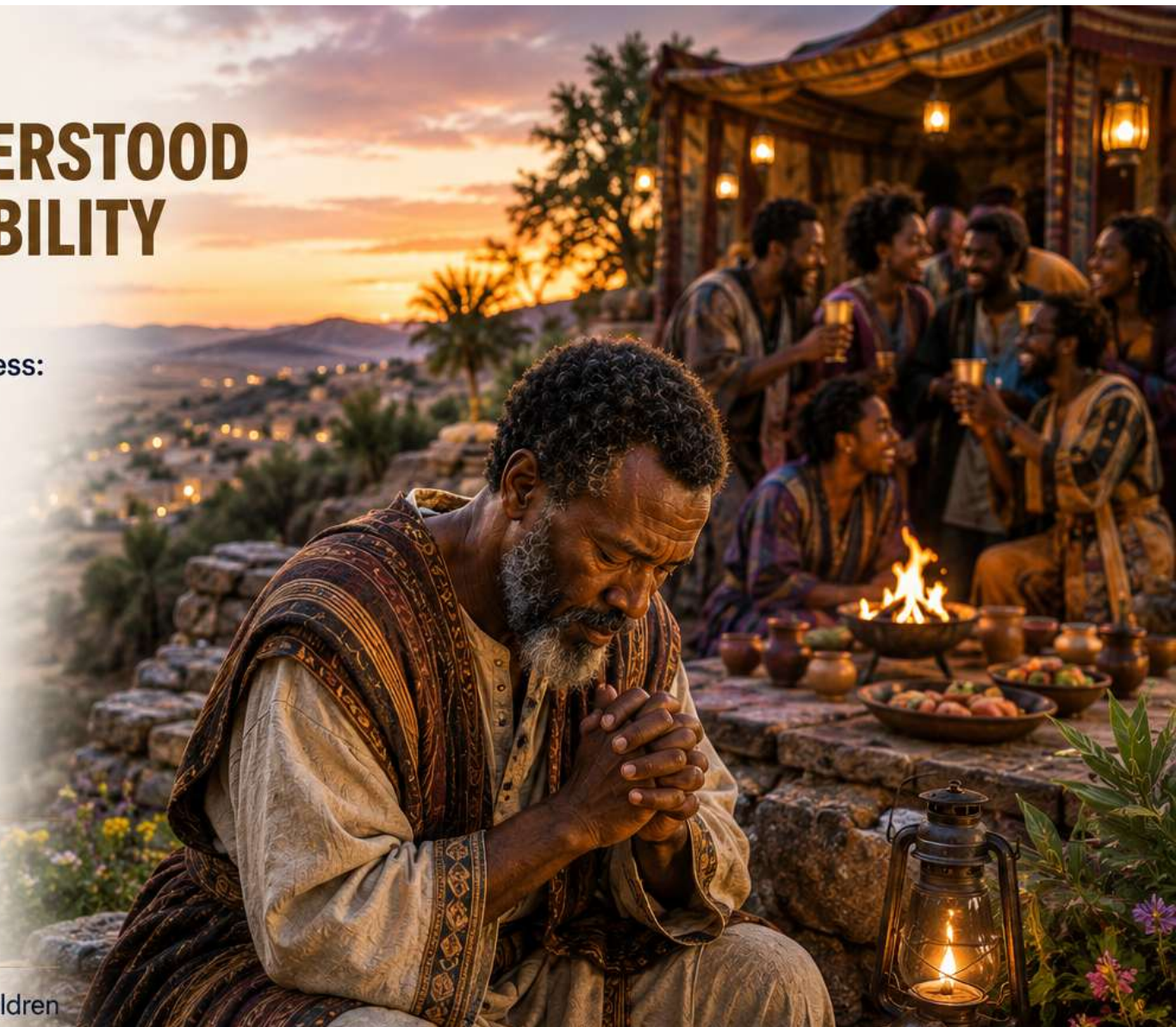


Did not assume that because things looked good on the outside, everything was right on the inside



Took spiritual responsibility for his household even when his children were grown

Job was not a controlling father. He allowed his children



POINT 3 — A FATHER WHOSE FAITH HELD EVEN WHEN PRAYERS WEREN'T “ENOUGH” (JOB 1:13–19; 2:9–10)

Here is the part of Job's story that challenges every praying father most deeply. Job prayed faithfully. He rose early. He interceded for each child. And his children still died (Job 1:18–19).



This is not a comfortable truth — but it is an honest one. Job's prayers did not prevent catastrophe.



And yet, when his wife urged him to curse God and die, Job responded: *“Shall we accept good from God, and not trouble?” — Job 2:10*



Job did not abandon his faith. He did not conclude that prayer was pointless. He held on to the
