

Senior Moments with Jay

Paul wrote to a young pastor named Timothy to instruct him and encourage him in his ministry. I read this article and thought it was good to share.

“Just as the early church needed Timothy... *your church needs you!* Do you ever feel like our culture sends mixed messages about young adults and leadership? On one hand, young adults are often criticized for not stepping up and exercising leadership and being involved – either leadership over others or self-leadership. On the other hand, it can be difficult for young adults to find opportunities to lead and good mentors to teach them how. Maybe your church is a wonderful exception, but this reality often plays out in churches. The older leaders talk about younger leaders, but they don’t provide on-ramps for young leaders to get started. This is one of the reasons the letters to Timothy are great for young adults to read and study. It’s not directly about leadership, per se, but the context says volumes to and about young leaders. Timothy, the recipient of this letter, is young, though we’re never told his age. Paul’s encouragement and warning in these letters is set in the context of a deep respect and love for Timothy. Paul want to keep Timothy from making a number of rookie mistake: teaching in circles, forgetting that the end goal is love, and thinking that leadership is only about him. Apparently many around Timothy focused on nuances of words or phrases in the Jewish law. Paul reminds Timothy that even when he’s just learned a fun fact or discovered the nuance of a certain position, the better approach as a leader is to keep things clear. Paul reminds Timothy throughout the letters to keep his message simple and focused on Jesus. Paul then reminds Timothy that the goal of faith is love. Timothy is to preach God’s love, understand the love that is in Christ Jesus, and invite others to live in that love. But here’s the subtext that’s too important to miss: Just as the early church needed Timothy, *your church needs you!* As easy as it would be to point fingers at those in power, blaming them for not allowing young leaders to rise up (*which might be true in some churches*), you can only take responsibility for yourself! Are you like Timothy, exercising leadership when and where you can, starting with your own life? Are you proving yourself to be a capable leader? Every young leader makes rookie mistakes! But your mistakes are probably your best chance to learn. Find a leadership mentor (*like Paul was for Timothy*). Start with self-leadership, discipline of your own life, then look for opportunities to stretch into leading others. And here’s an idea worth considering: Everyone is a leader. You are a leader. Leading might play out in obvious ways. But even if you don’t have the personality traits people associated with leadership, you are still called to be a leader. Even if you’re shy or feel you have no power, you can lead others by giving an example they can follow and by influencing them with your life. That’s actually the most powerful kind of leadership there is!

Start with yourself – you are called to lead yourself! Self-leadership is the difference, really, between a growing person and a stagnant one. As you lead yourself, you might find yourself leading others. Then it will be the most natural thing in the world!”
