

**League of Northern Colorado Quilters**  
**General Meeting Minutes**  
**Best Western Hotel, Loveland, Colorado**  
**Monday, April 6, 2026 – 6:00 PM**

1. Joan Fulton (“Joan”), President, opened the general meeting with a welcome and introduction to Lori Jonker (“Lori”), the program presenter for the meeting.

Lori related how her math background influenced her design process, which includes inspiration, concept drawings and planning. During her trunk show, she explained how these steps influenced the design of her displayed quilts.

2. Joan welcomed guests attending the meeting followed by the reading of a thank you note from Alycia Carmin, of Quilts of Valor, a presenter at the March general meeting.
3. Door Prizes – four door prizes were awarded to members chosen at random.
4. Logo – The results of the membership vote on the new logo were announced. 60% of the members who voted chose the new logo, a copy of which was displayed. Existing materials with the prior logo will be used up with the new logo used for future orders.
5. Joan and Crystal Wentz, 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President, provided updates on the following:
  - a. The Quilted Forest– a workday is scheduled for the morning preceding the June general meeting with another workday possible during the summer.
  - b. Plans for the June 6<sup>th</sup> garage sale are continuing; donations may be dropped off at LNCQ general meetings. Unsold donations will not be returned.
  - c. Joan is coordinating a LNCQ table for the Rocky Mountain Quilt Museum’s (“RMQM”) auction and fundraiser. Interested persons should contact Joan for more information.
6. Joan presented a PowerPoint slideshow of programs scheduled for the balance of 2026 listing the scheduled textile artists along with illustrations of their work.

7. Announcements of the June In-Town Retreat, the Fall Retreat and Community Sew Days were made.
8. General Business
  - a. Financial reporting – Joan noted that the current financial transactions are generally consistent with the previously presented 2026 budget, except for the purchase of the projector and additional power towers, irons and pressing mats; and
  - b. Joan continues her work with on planning for the Kid’s Kamp, a joint venture with RMQM; volunteers needed.
9. Show and Tell – Seven quilts were shown by members along with various charity quilts being donated to community organizations.
