President Joan Fulton called the meeting to order and extended a warm welcome to all in attendance. As a reminder to the group, Joan explained the procedure for Show and Tell, that anyone showing a quilt should complete an information sheet about their quilt that will be read by the Show and Tell Chair as the quilt is displayed at the front of the room, that there will be holders and folders available to make the show proceed quickly and smoothly.

Joan introduced Julie Aanonsen, Program Host, to introduce the guest speaker, Linda Salitrynski. Linda is an award winning quilter having received several 'Best of Show' awards, as well as other awards in Paducah, Houston and Quilters Expo in Wisconsin. Linda established Country Keepsakes in 1987, and it has continued to grow and evolve over the past thirty-eight years. Country Keepsakes sells designer fabrics, quilting notions and thread. Linda also offers unique hand dyed 100 percent Pimatex cotton fabrics.

Linda entertained us with the story of her history and evolution as a quilter. She has studied with well known quilt artists including Michael James, Nancy Crow, Libby Lehman and Hollis Chatelain. She illustrated her presentation with a trunk show of her actual quilts. The audience was treated to a show of her beautiful and unique quilts.

7. Report from Carla Lucas about special events. There will be quilted postcard exchange with the Rochester, NY guild May 1 - 15. The 2025 UFO Challenge continues for \$5 per entry. The 2025 Round Robin has 47 participants. Carla is looking into a day trip by bus to Denver. More information to follow.
