

Alternating stars (44" x 58")

Fabric Requirements

1. Main print 1 ¼ yard
2. Light fabric 1 yard
3. Dark fabric 1 1/8 yard

Cutting

Cut (24) 3 ½" squares of each of the light and dark fabrics for the corners

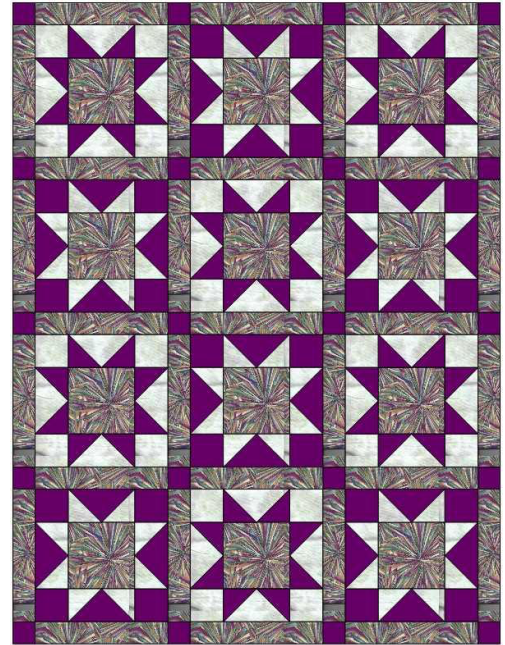
Cut (12) 6 ½" squares of the main print fabric for the centers

Cut (6) 7 ½" squares of each of the light and dark fabrics for the geese (these are oversized so you can trim to perfection)

Cut (24) 4 ¼" squares of each of the light and dark fabrics for the geese (these are oversized so you can trim to perfection)

Cut (31) 2 ½" x 12 ½" of the main print fabric for the sashing

Cut (20) 2 ½" squares of the dark fabric for the cornerstones



Making the star blocks



You will make 6 with dark star points and 6 with light star points

Flying geese:

- Use (1) 7 ½" square of one color and (4) 4 ¼" squares of the other color
- Follow instructions found on-line by searching for "4 at a time flying geese"
- Cut down your geese to 3 ½" x 6 ½"

Assemble the stars according to the layout in the picture. Your star block should measure 12 ½" square.

Quilt Assembly

Build Rows:

- Add one strip of sashing to one side of each star block.
- Assemble into rows of 3 blocks, alternating colorways
- Add sashing to the block at the end of the row that is missing a sashing
- Make 2 rows of dark points/light points/dark points
- Make 2 rows of light points/dark points/light points

Sew Rows Together

- Sew a cornerstone to a sashing piece, repeat for a total of 3 sets, add a cornerstone to the end. Make (5) of these
- Sew this complete sashing strip to a row of your quilt, lining up the intersections
- Repeat for the remaining rows, alternating row color sets
- Sew rows together, finishing with the last sashing set
