

Town Square 47" x 62"

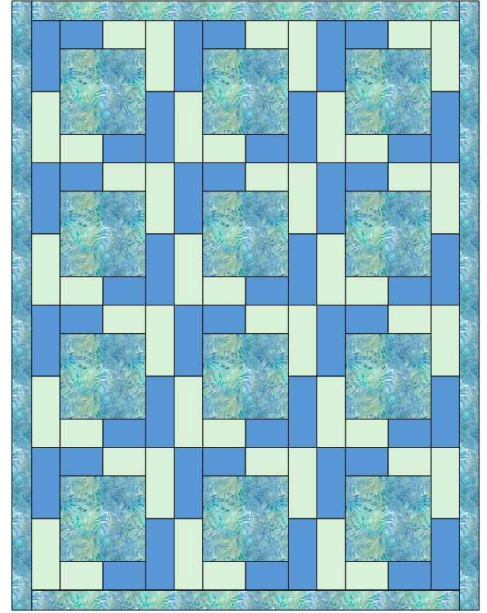

Fabric Requirements

- 1 yard of each of 3 fabrics. If the width of fabric 2 or 3 is less than 42" usable inches, you will need 1 1/4 yards of that fabric.

Cutting

- Fabric 1 (main print)
 - (3) 9" strips. Sub-cut (12) 9" squares
 - (6) 2 1/2" strips
- Fabric 2 (light accent)
 - (Note: if your fabric is not at least 42" of usable width, you will need an extra strip of 7 3/4" (use what you need, then cut down to 4 3/4" to finish the other strip set)
 - (2) 4 3/4" strips
 - (2) 7 3/4" strips
- Fabric 3 (dark accent)
 - (Note: if your fabric is not at least 42" of usable width, you will need an extra strip of 7 3/4" (use what you need, then cut down to 4 3/4" to finish the other strip set)
 - (2) 4 3/4" strips
 - (2) 7 3/4" strips



Block Assembly

	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Make 2 strips sets with one strip each of Fabric 3 (4 3/4") and Fabric 2 (4 3/4"). Your strip should be 9" wide. 2. Sub-cut your strip sets into (24) 3 1/2" x 9" units. If your fabric isn't 42" wide, you will need to make a short strip set to make the rest of the units
	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 3. Make 2 strips sets with one strip each of Fabric 3 (7 3/4") and Fabric 2 (7 3/4"). Your strip should be 15" wide. 4. Sub-cut your strip sets into (24) 3 1/2" x 15" units. If your fabric isn't 42" wide, you will need to make a short strip set to make the rest of the units.
	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 5. Sew one strip of the pieces made in step 2 to the top and bottom of a Fabric 1 9" square, placing the fabrics as shown. Your unit should measure 9" x 15".
	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 6. Sew one strip of the pieces made in step 4 to the sides of your unit, placing the fabrics as shown. Your new unit should measure 15" square

Assembling the quilt

1. Sew three blocks together into a row, making 4 rows
2. Sew the 4 rows together
3. Measure your quilt width at the top and bottom of the quilt. Take the average of these measurements and make 2 strips of that length using 2 1/2" wide strips of Fabric 1.
4. Sew these two strips to the top and bottom of your quilt
5. Measure your quilt length at the right and left side of the quilt.
6. Take the average of these measurements and make 2 strips of that length using 2 1/2" wide strips of Fabric 1.
7. Sew these two strips to the sides of your quilt
