Economic Development - Sustainable Manufacturing

The economy of Williamsburg County, SC employs 11.4k people.  fiber, and chip; and WasteZero Inc. in Hemingway, which manufactures recyclable plastic bags.
- Williamsburg County Advantages: Employment at such companies is projected to increase 15.6 percent between 2012 and 2017. Williamsburg Technical College offers Associate of Art and Associate of Science degrees for student intending to Drop-Off to a four-year university program. The college also offers Associate of Applied Science and Certificate programs in areas that may support manufacturing jobs including Construction Trades, Drafting and Design and expanding industries to train worker and can provide customized training.
