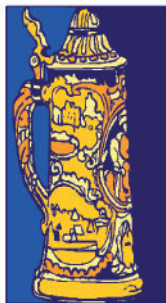

did YOU? know

The first Festival by the newly formed Ethnic Enrichment Commission (EEC) was Sunday, June 1, 1980, on the Liberty Memorial Mall. The next three Festivals were two-day events in August at Washington Square Park. By 1984, the Ethnic Festival needed more space and moved to Swope Park. In 1985, the Festival expanded to the whole weekend and has been the third full weekend in August ever since.

The Ethnic Festival is produced in partnership with the KCMO Parks & Recreation Department. The EEC is proud to have a 501 c 3 designation, with all of its member countries sponsored by nonprofits. The Ethnic Festival is a labor of love, as none of the performers or EEC workers are paid for their participation. We are proud to be able to produce a quality Festival showcasing our native countries for the metropolitan area to enjoy. We hope you make some memories this weekend.

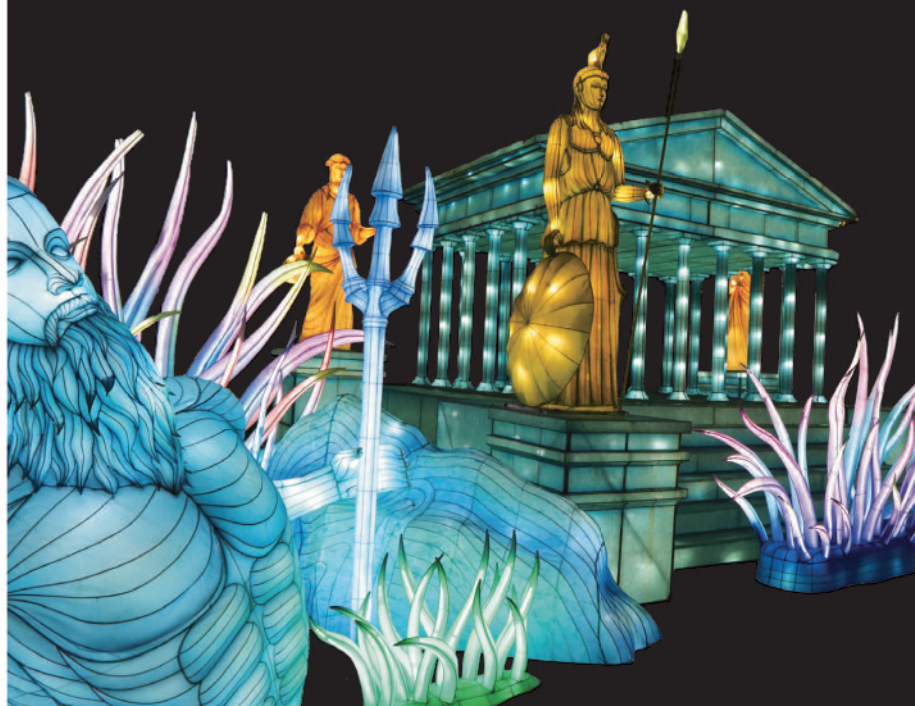
