## HELP KEEP THIS PLAY EQUIPMENT COVID-19 SECURE

All playground visitors are encouraged to note and follow the following guidance:

- 1. You must not use the play equipment if you or anyone in your household has COVID-19 symptoms.
- 2. Children should not use this equipment if they are clinically or extremely clinically vulnerable.
- 3. **If you develop COVID-19 symptoms within 7 days** of visiting the playground alert Test, Track and Trace. Alert the Village Hall Chairman, Chris Bradbury on 07472 272484.
- 4. The play equipment is checked regularly for damage and wear and tear, but is not sanitised or disinfected.
- 5. The play equipment is shared equipment, with use at the users own risk.
- 6. Parents and carers should encourage children not to put their mouths on play equipment and to avoid touching their faces.
- 7. **Maintain 2 metres social distancing as far as possible**. Follow the current social distance guidelines when visiting, with parents and carers encouraging children to do the same. You **must** maintain social distancing from others unless they are from the same household.
- 8. Some equipment can only be used by one child at a time while social distancing. Please ensure your family waits at a safe distance if the equipment is in use or return later to use the equipment.
- 9. If the playground is busy, consider coming back at a later time.
- 10. Avoid touching your face, nose, or eyes. Clean your hands if you do.
- 11. **"Catch it, Bin it, Kill it".** Tissues should be disposed of in a litter bin or taken home. Then wash your hands.
- 12. If disposable masks, face coverings or gloves etc are worn, they should be disposed by placing them in a litter bin or taking home. Littering is not acceptable.
- 13. Visitors are encouraged to wash their hands, with hand sanitiser if needed, regularly and as a minimum before and after using the play equipment. Wash your hands when you get home for 20 seconds using soap and water.
- 14. Wash your clothes when you get home to reduce risk of transmission.
