OUR CALL



Our mission is to share the good news of Jesus Christ's mercy and grace for us sinners with our brothers and sisters experiencing homelessness. We provide our brothers and sisters with food and life necessities, and help along the way toward rehabilitation, the healing of one's life, and stability.

Our vision is to be a caring, loving, growing community of Christians who preach the Gospel, teach God's Word, and extend the compassion of Christ to our homeless brothers and sisters in Atlanta so that they can be identified, built up and unified in the Body of Christ.

SHARING & CARING MINISTRIES



For brothers and sisters living in homelessness, a healthy meal, a backpack and good pair of socks, a loving smile, and a kind word can have a significant impact on their lives. Through our sharing and caring ministries, we comfort our brothers and sisters in need with the good news of Jesus Christ and life necessities.

SATURDAY SERVICE

Every Saturday, we serve meals and daily necessities in downtown Atlanta. This service time begins with praise worship, the sharing of the Gospel, and prayer at 8:00 AM, followed by food, counseling, and fellowship. During this time, we deliver necessities to the brothers and sisters we encounter, including men, women, and children of all ages. Following Through these encounters, the Gospel is being proclaimed to hundreds upon hundreds each year.



HISPANIC OUTREACH

Twice a month, our ministry team delivers food and daily necessities to more 50 Hispanic brothers. While many do not speak or understand English, they are clearly grateful to receive the love of Jesus through a hot cup of coffee, healthy meal, and loving eyes. We visit our Hispanic brothers who gather along Buford Highway, in Duluth and Norcross, and in communities across metro Atlanta.



SHARING & CARING FESTIVALS

Our festivals are special sharing and caring events to serve the Gospel of Jesus Christ followed by food and daily life necessities in downtown Atlanta. More than 400 brothers and sisters visit during these event times to hear God's Word and receive His gifts. These events are a wonderful opportunity to connect with our brothers and sisters and engage in some meaningful fellowship in Christ.

We hold these events during Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Easter times. And, in partnership with the Lutheran Outreach Partnership, we hold a special festival in September.



ANNUAL WINTER COAT DRIVE

In wintry weather, a heavy jacket can be a life-saving gift for those experiencing homelessness and living on the streets. Stepping Stone coordinates an annual winter coat drive, beginning in September, in partnership with sister churches. These jackets are shared with our brothers and sisters during the chilly weather months, beginning as early as September, during our regular serving times as well as through special events at Thanksgiving and Christmas times.

LEADERSHIP TRAINING & EDUCATION MINISTRIES



WEEKLY BIBLE STUDIES

God's Word is a lamp to our feet and a light to our path. (Psalm 119:105) Through our weekly Bible studies, we have seen countless examples of how the Word of the Lord changes lives and remains in the hearts of His children forever. This is a discipleship ministry through which our brothers do a deep dive into the Word of God every Friday, memorize Bible verses, share their faith, and engage in prayer ministry for each other.



REHABILITATION AND SPIRITUAL LEADERSHIP RETREATS

Our retreats are three days long and trainees are selected from the brothers who participate in training programs on Fridays and Saturday Worship Services as well as brothers referred by these brothers. Our retreats further equip brothers for their discipleship and service to the Lord. Trainees engage in active learning through sessions taught by pastors and other ministers serving in churches throughout the Atlanta region. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, 33 brothers have become baptized children of God during our retreats. Praise God!

WORSHIP MINISTRIES



SATURDAY WORSHIP SERVICE

Through the grace of God, we are ambassadors for Jesus in connecting our homeless brothers and sisters with Him and with each other. Our homeless brothers and sisters share a sense of community set apart from the streets, centered in Christ, and designed for spiritual transformation. They have discovered that God's love unites us, His children, across social barriers as we grow together into the fullness of Christ. Our Saturday Worship Services are a time of blessed fellowship for all concerned. These services are held on Saturdays, 9:00 AM, at Ponce Church in Downtown Atlanta.

Our Saturday Worship Service brothers serve as Christ's disciples in their mission fields, which include area shelters, public parks, under bridges, and the streets. Our Lord Jesus is clearly empowering our brothers through this body building in His Word to live a new life in Christ!



STEPPING STONE CHOIR TEAM

Many of our homeless brothers have served as members of our Stepping Stone Choir Team, lending their voices to beautiful songs of praise. They are taught to sing Gospel hymns in both English and Korean. They sing during our Music Concert and upon invitation from area churches to serve at special events and church services, especially during Advent and Christmastime. Our brothers love to visit

with brothers and sisters at churches in metro Atlanta and beyond and share the Gospel of Jesus Christ through their gift of voice.

YOUTH MISSION MINISTRIES



Over the years, Stepping Stone has served as a frequent host for Youth Mission Trips. During these trips, high school or college students join our ministry team for a few days to serve the homeless. Examples of past youth missions include joining us to serve brothers and sisters on the streets of Atlanta, co-leading some of our Rehabilitation & Spiritual Leadership Retreats and conducting service projects to further prepare our mission center for future ministry use. These young disciples are always a source of inspiration for our ministry team as they energetically bless all those around them.

NEW LIFE GARDENS PROJECT



With God's mighty help, Stepping Stone Mission acquired a beautiful property in Conyers, Georgia to serve as the birthplace for the New Life Gardens. Thanks be to God for His provision through the profitable sale of a previous property and the contributions of gracious donors, our team secured financing with the Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF), a critical ministry partner. The 33-acre property includes a 3,962 square-foot ranch house, an outdoor worship chapel, a large barn, a pond stocked with fish, farmable land, a

notable presence of trees, hay, and other natural resources.

A significant expansion to our ministry, this project's rural site provides a serene environment for establishing our Stepping Stone Mission Center (base of operations), a center for retreats and worship, a working farm, community gardens and walking trails for times of prayer and meditation, and cabin-living accommodations. The project aims to foster faith, love, and hope among those we serve.

Our vision for New Life Gardens is to serve as a sanctuary for our brothers experiencing homelessness where they can worship, stay, learn, recreate, and serve together in Christian fellowship.
