
# Photograph time again!



# **Dobcross Youth Band**

On April 6<sup>th</sup> The Youth band received the devastating news that our wonderful Librarian Rosemary Whiffin had passed away very suddenly and unexpectedly. Rosemasy and her husband Peter joined our Band family over 30 years ago when they brought their son Robert to join the band. Robert took up the trombone and still plays, currently with Greenfield Band. Rosemary and Peter soon became dedicated supporters of the band, Peter joined the committee and Rosemary became our librarian.

Anyone who knows about Brass bands will understand the librarian's job is certainly not stress free. Having a filing system that works, photocopying all parts [never give out originals!] at a moment's notice for MD's, getting copies back to file after the piece has been removed from the programme, laminating and putting together march pads and hymn pads for all parts, to name a few of the jobs covered. Multiply that by upwards of 100 members of a Youth Band who come along to rehearsals and engagements with the cry, "I've lost my music"," I never had this piece","I've left my music at home/school" even "the puppy chewed my music!" Rosemary patiently reproduced the part, sometimes with a well-deserved reprimand to persistent offenders. She put together folders of the programme of music for our tours and always carried a file of spares to contest. As Steve Beardmore, Training Band MD said to his Band, "Every piece of music you have will remind you of this lovely lady. Look after your music in respect of her memory". We were so fortunate to have an absolute gem.

Rosemary was a Physiotherapist in her professional life and this led to her taking on the role of First Aider to

the band. Although all the committee and volunteers hold First Aid certificates, Rosemary took the lead. Two first aid kits, one for Trainers and one for the Youth Band. She kept them meticulously up to date. Rosemary will be remembered by many of our children for her kindness and care for anyone feeling unwell, especially on engagements and band trips.


We all said goodbye to Rosemary on Wednesday, 14th May at Holy Trinity Church, Dobcross where Rosemary was an active member in the church she loved so much. The Church was filled with family from near and far; friends, ex colleagues, representatives of the many causes she supported and members of the Dobcross Community. The service was a true celebration of her life, the many spoken tributes filled with wonderful memories and lovely, funny anecdotes of her life. As was so fitting, the music was a reflection of Rosemary, with her favourite hymns, a beautiful rendition of "The Lord Bless You and Keep you," by the choir. Many members of the Youth Band came out of school and college and along with ex members and parents to play a moving tribute, arranged by James Atkins, of three pieces that reflected Rosemary's involvement with the Band Family, 'Hail Smiling Morn', 'Be Still', and 'Bring me Sunshine'.

Thank you so much to Peter, Robert and the Family and everyone who played a part in this very special service for a very special lady, who left on her final journey to the applause of those who came to honour her. She is missed.

#### **Nature Notes**


One afternoon in mid-May, two small black birds with long, narrow, curved wings were flying fast around the streets of Uppermill and up over the roof- tops, making a screaming sound - rather like excited children on a roller- coaster. They were swifts, one of the insecteating bird species which return here every year to breed. They will leave again in just a couple of months, to spend the rest of the year in southern Africa.

Once a young swift is ready to leave its nest, it will spend almost its entire life on the wing, feeding, mating and even sleeping while airborne. It's thought that the two halves of their brains can sleep separately, so that there is always one half awake. They have very short legs, because they hardly ever need to use them except for clambering in and out of their nest holes, which are usually in a hole in an old building. They can fly at very high altitudes and their legs are covered with tiny white feathers to stop them losing too much body heat.

As with many other insect-eating species, the number of swifts has declined drastically over recent years. One reason is the loss of nesting sites, as old buildings are renovated and holes in the roofs are being blocked up. To compensate, the designers of new buildings are being encouraged to use special swift bricks in their walls, with horizontally elongated holes giving access to holes in the cavities. Another reason for the decline has probably been the shortage of insect food in recent years. Hopefully they are appreciating the clouds of greenflies which are around this spring. Incidentally, several drivers have commented to me on the numbers of insects they are finding on their car windowscreens and numberplates this year.

#### FOOTPATH AND FOOTBRIDGE UPDATE

I mentioned last month that I was hoping to have a face-to-face meeting with Oldham's Director of Environment to finally establish what options are acceptable to replace the bridge as soon as possible, and the good news is that I have an appointment to meet him on Thursday 22 May. That is after the copy date for this Diary so watch out for a detail report next month! In the meantime, I have obtained a price for a minimum standard footbridge which would cost £5,600 delivered in kit form, but that would need some arrangement either paid or voluntary to assemble it! It would have the advantage of the bridge being replaced within the designated width of the footpath so the work itself would not need

#### PROCESSION OF WITNESS (WHIT WALKS)

**9.45 am** The Procession of Witness leaves the Band Club and marches to The Square for a short service. At 10.30am, the procession leaves the village via Woods Lane and Dobcross New Road into Uppermill.

**12 noon (approximately)** The procession returns from Uppermill via Wool Road and Sugar Lane and disbands in The Square
