

# **Welcome to Dobcross**

Here are a few things you may like to know about Dobcross, and a list of useful information on amenities, clubs and organisations around the village.



Dobcross is one of several villages that make up Saddleworth. It was originally in the West Riding of Yorkshire; some people still say it is, and became the commercial hub of Saddleworth as it was on the main

Yorkshire and Lancashire pack horse route, with roads converging on Dobcross Square. In the 1900s, with several shops, pubs and Saddleworth Bank, one



of England's original banks, it was where business was primarily based on the wool trade. As the textile industry declined in the mid-20th century, the industry and shops were replaced with housing and Dobcross is now popular

with commuters to Manchester and Leeds and nearby Uppermill became the central village.

There are various groups, clubs and organisations in Dobcross who all work together to create a vibrant community spirit. One of these groups is the Dobcross Village Community, or DVC. This group arranges events throughout the year to raise funds for the benefit of the other groups in Dobcross, helping with repairs or replacements of equipment and funding defibrillators.

The DVC produces a monthly newsletter called the Dobcross Diary, written by residents, which is sent out to more than 950 households in the village, with copies left in appropriate places for visitors to read, as well as sent via email to ex-residents all over the country. This newsletter is designed to inform everyone with local information, news and updates from Dobcross clubs, events of interest and issues which affect our village. We have included a map in this leaflet so you see you have moved to a village that covers a wide area of Saddleworth.

The following pages have details of what is available in and around the village. For anyone on Facebook, there are two local sites. Dobcross News and Dobcross Community Group for day to day updates.

# The Square

The main shopping area in the past was the Square but the interesting buildings and old shops have now been converted into family homes and flats. Many of the houses in Dobcross are



historically important and are therefore listed properties.



One of these is the popular Swan Inn and nearby stands a monument erected by public subscription in 1901. Dedicated to Dr Walter Ramsden it was followed by a further inscription to his Grandson, WPB Stonehouse, also a physician.

## Leading from the Square are four roads:

Walking down **Woods Lane** you will find our well stocked **Village Store and Post Office** with helpful, friendly staff. The post office also has facilities for banking and delivery of parcels from some on-line companies.

Next door is **Saddler Gentlemen Co**, a modern gentlemen's grooming service; hair and skin care for discerning men.





Beyond that is **Holy Trinity Church**, a Grade II-listed church which was built in 1787 and stands at the heart of the village in the Dobcross Conservation area. With good acoustics, musical concerts are occasionally held there and the meeting room is used regularly.

Further down at the bottom of the road is **Holy Trinity Church of England School** for our primary aged children from pre-school to year 6. Replacing the old school some years ago, it has some interesting architectural features.





Back to the Square and going down **Sugar Lane** towards Diggle, there's a steep short cut to walk down to Uppermill and on the main road, underneath the imposing viaduct is the canal and the **Lime Kiln café**. Another popular pub, the **Navigation**, can be found further towards Diggle.

From the Square, **Sandy Lane** will take you on a single track road to Diggle and Long Lane to the Lancashire family's dairy farm who produce **Saddleworth Milk**, and then to open countryside, home to a variety of wildlife.



From the Square along **Platt Lane**, is **Dobcross Band and Social Club** which is run by a committee of volunteers. You can join this club for a small annual fee. (See the back page for details). The club house is used by various organisations but particularly to the three brass bands that practise here. Home to the well-known Dobcross Silver Band, it is also home to Dobcross Youth Band and the Brass Monkeys, an adult training band for people

who would like to try a brass instrument for the first time or return to one after time away. A large reception room at the club is ideal for large parties, wedding receptions and other events.



Each month a pop-up coffee shop is held here and Pilates classes are held here too several times a week. Snooker and darts are played in the club room and there is a separate bar area. There is also a crown green bowling section, whose members also use the club house. There is a lovely view over the valley towards the war memorial, known as Pots and Pans and onto Saddleworth Moor, so it is a popular spot to watch the bowling on a sunny summer afternoon.



Beyond the club, towards Delph, **The Old Toll House** is a family-run tea room and small garden centre. Home cooked food and a selection of plants and garden miscellany.

# **During the year...**

The DVC is an all-inclusive group whose aims are to inform residents of any issues which may affect the village, such as planning and traffic. However, it is committed to having fun too! So, at Christmas, it organises a quiz and Father Christmas comes to watch the lights switched on! Christmas Day sees most of the village packed into the Band Club to sing carols with a small select brass ensemble, in aid of a group for our older residents, affectionately known as the Elderberries.





Saddleworth is well known for its footpaths, walking and cycling routes but is also known for the Whit Friday Band Contest in late spring, when 100 or so Brass Bands from the UK and abroad, including our own, take part in evening contests in each village, following a religious procession of witness to Uppermill in the morning. Children are entertained with lunch and games in the afternoon. These events are arranged by a local committee of dedicated volunteers, the Whit Friday Committee.

At Holy Trinity School, the School PTA, known as the Friends of Dobcross School or FODS, raise funds throughout the year, holding various events and a school fête in summer, to finance special occasions and equipment.



Holy Trinity school is located between the River Tame and Leavers Wood, and the river and wood converge behind the school to act as a natural wildlife corridor. A site of biological Interest, it is full of English bluebells in the spring and blackberries in autumn. Various wildlife populates this area, together with many species of birds.





Morris teams from around the country descend on Saddleworth over the Rush Cart weekend in August. On the Saturday, teams perform in each village while transporting a large cart of rushes, and on Sunday they pull the cart uphill from Uppermill to Saddleworth Church, where traditional dancing and merriment ensue!

Saddleworth Olympics take place each September. For children in years 3 -12, ages 7 to 16, every village in Saddleworth competes against each other in various sports. Started in 1985, it is as popular as ever.



Some of our Dobcross residents open their gardens for festivals, charity and the National Garden Scheme and volunteers look after the public areas outside the school, planters in the Square and the Memorial Garden opposite the church where our Silent Soldier can be found.

Delph and Dobcross Cricket Club not only play cricket but hold club events, with a jam-packed schedule of music and fun.

Delph hosts a small but well used theatre, Millgate Arts Centre. Local actors, the Saddleworth Players, and the youth section, SPY, use the theatre, while Saddleworth Live host special shows throughout the year. Concert and film societies are also based there.

The Saddleworth area has many flourishing clubs, organisations, and musical societies, too many to mention here!


