Job Description:

This position performs technical-level firefighting duties, emergency rescue, and hazardous materials handling duties. This position may be assigned to a particular fire company or division, selected applicant responsibility for the facility's operation. Supervises and directs personnel assigned to shifts. Work is performed under the general direction of a Deputy, Assistant, Division, or Fire Chief. Performs duties of other administrative personnel as required.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES:

OPERATIONS / TRAINING CHIEF/ PREVENTION:

Supervises staff to prioritize and assign work; conducts performance evaluations; ensures staff is adequately trained; provides that employees follow policies and procedures; maintains a healthy and safe working environment; and makes hiring, termination, and disciplinary recommendations, and conducts employee evaluations.

Plans, leads, supports, maintains, and controls emergency and non-emergency calls, coordinating automatic and mutual aid resources with surrounding communities.

Conducts regular meetings with staff to relay and receive information and communicate policies and directives; communicates with volunteer officers and members.

Supervises and facilitates training sessions and overall development of subordinate officers.

Coordinates, supervises, and schedules the repairs. All so recommends purchases of fire department equipment, including self-contained breathing apparatus, personal protective equipment, fire apparatus, associated equipment, radio, paging equipment, lawn, and small engine items; may also supervise the work of outside contractors.

Coordinates all insurance and safety inspections of district facilities.

Monitors compliance with applicable safety standards at emergency and non-emergency scenes; follows up with staff regarding non-compliance.

Manages a comprehensive department-wide training program, including determining appropriate courses, texts, materials, and instructors. Programs include fire, emergency medical services, fire officer, special operations, hazardous materials topics, etc.

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Provides course instruction, as needed, for all training courses.

May serve as the department Safety Officer and responds as needed to emergency incidents.

Provides oversight and directs the operations and activities of fire prevention, which includes planning, coordinating, administering, and evaluating programs, projects, processes, procedures, systems, standards, ordinances, and service offerings; ensures compliance with Federal, State, and local laws, regulations, codes, and standards; coordinates activities between multiple service areas; works to integrate and coordinate service areas.

Develops, organizes, and administers a variety of fire prevention programs, which includes fire code inspections, life safety, public information and education, and other related issues.

Directs and oversees the enforcement of applicable local and state fire codes.

Prepares, reviews, interprets, and analyzes various information, data, construction plans, and reports; makes recommendations based on findings.

Assists in the preparation and administration of the district budget; prepares cost estimates for budget recommendations; submits justifications for budget items; monitors and controls expenditures.

Serves as a liaison with employees and external organizations; represents the District at various meetings, public events, training sessions, committees, and other related events.

Performs other duties assigned.

TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE:

Associates degree in Business Management, Fire Science, Emergency Medicine, Emergency Management or other related field and a minimum of eight years of work experience as a firefighter, four of which were in a supervisory and leadership role; or, an equivalent combination of education and experience sufficient to successfully perform the essential duties of the job such as those listed above. Bachelor's degree highly desirable

PREFERRED SKILLS:

Experience as a Volunteer Firefighter or working in a Combination Fire Service.

ADDITIONAL NOTES:

Applicants must be tobacco-free and remain so throughout employment. Must live within 30 miles of the district. This position requires a 24-hour response to various types of incidents.

Unless otherwise noted, applicants must have required certifications at the time of application.
