<b>Job Description</b>			
<p><b>ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES:</b></p> <p>Supervises staff to prioritize and assign work; conducts performance evaluations; ensures staff are trained; ensures that employees follow policies and procedures; maintains a healthy and safe working environment; and makes hiring, termination, and disciplinary decisions or recommendations.</p> <p>Responds to and mitigates all types of fires and other emergencies; extinguishes fires and performs related life and property protection; provides emergency medical care at a basic and advanced life support level; serves in a command role at emergency and non-emergency scenes;</p> <p>Participates in training opportunities and physical fitness activities;</p> <p>Prepares, reviews, and maintains a variety of paperwork, reports, and documents to ensure accuracy and completeness of information;</p> <p>Conducts pre-fire plan surveys to prepare and orient crew members to risk factors associated with commercial structures that pose a unique danger to firefighting crews;</p> <p>Participates in training and continuing education initiatives and opportunities;</p> <p>Ensures the proper condition, maintenance, and appearance of apparatus and equipment; prepares apparatus for immediate response;</p> <p>Drives emergency vehicles and operates related apparatus to respond to emergency calls and scenes when needed;</p> <p>Participates in the daily functions of the fire station, which may include housekeeping, cooking, making crew assignments, or performing other related duties as directed.</p> <p><b>Position may be assigned to Training Section:</b> Manages a comprehensive department-wide training program, which includes determining appropriate courses, texts, materials, and instructors. Programs include fire, emergency medical services, fire officer, special operations, hazardous materials topics, etc., and provide course instruction for all training courses, as needed. Responds as needed to emergency incidents.</p>

### **Training and Experience (positions in this class typically require):**

High School Diploma or equivalent (G.E.D.) (Associate or Bachelor's Degree preferred) Must have five creditable active years in the Fire Service.

### **Licensing Requirements:**

Florida Firefighter Certificate of Compliance as issued by the State Fire Marshal's Office;

Fire Officer I certification as issued by the Florida State Fire Marshal's Office;

Fire Service Instructor I certification (*Must be obtained within 12 months*)

State of Florida Apparatus Operator Certification;

Completion of the 45-hour Aerial Operations Class (*Must be obtained within 12 months*);

State of Florida certification as an Emergency Medical Technician; Paramedic preferred;

Must possess the state and local required certifications for the medical certificates as mandated by the Medical Director;

Emergency Vehicle Drivers Training Certification.

Florida Driver's License.

Exception: A licensed driver who lives in another state and regularly travels to work in Florida may maintain an Operator's/Commercial Driver's license in the state of residency.

### **Knowledge (position requirements at entry):**

Knowledge of:

Supervisory principles;

Fire suppression techniques;

Modern firefighting and rescue principles and tactics;

Emergency medical care;

Occupational hazards and safety precautions;

Physical fitness principles;

Vehicle, equipment, and apparatus maintenance principles and techniques;

Applicable tools and equipment associated with firefighting;

Building construction concepts;

Emergency medical care, Hydraulic concepts, Physical fitness principles, Vehicle, equipment, and apparatus maintenance principles and techniques.

### **Skills (position requirements at entry):**

Skill in:

Providing emergency medical care;

Suppressing fires;

Using a computer and related software applications;

Maintaining vehicles, buildings, equipment, and apparatus;

Driving emergency response vehicles;

Conducting flow testing and service on hydrants;

Maintaining physical fitness;

Preparing and maintaining reports;

Communication and interpersonal skills, as applied to interaction with coworkers, supervisors, the general public, etc., are sufficient to exchange or convey information and to receive work direction.
