Since this building was demolished sometime between 1998 and 2001, all I have is lore about its haunting. Oddly, the library yearbook collection is missing the in-between years. In the last issue available, Moore is present like always. After the missing volumes, the next issue picks up with the building just gone.

Moore was the sister building of Harris Hall and was used as a residence for the male students of the Keystone Academy. The legend goes that the building's area coordinator had a fondness for young men, and that he took them into the attic to exploit them. As the police closed in, they followed his trail in the attic, where they found the rapist hanging ominously from the ceiling. He had taken his own life before he could be apprehended and publicly shamed for his actions.

Another legend comes from an anonymous poster on a forum from the early 2000s. This kind of thing was big back then, so I highly doubt its veracity. However, it's very interesting and worth sharing here. The poster explains that when he was an art student at Keystone in the late 1990s, he used to walk between the Art Centre and the ruins of Moore on his way back to his dorm residence each night. He said he used to see a "gray man" standing outside Harris smoking a cigarette or just loitering around watching him. When the man finally approached him and asked him to accompany him for a walk, the poster became distressed and started finding another way home at night. The poster claims that when he looked into the history of Moore and learned the legend of the predator-As recounted above, he found a photograph of a man in a grey jacket just like the figure he'd been seeing on his nightly walks past Moore. ----As noted, I highly doubt this one, but it's fascinating and ties into the previous piece of lore.
