



DID YOU KNOW?

The Shoreline School District is facing the likelihood of an enormous (~\$18m) budget cut for the 2023-24 school year due to the impacts of COVID and drops in enrollment. It is hard to imagine what this could mean for our kids and our schools, but it will certainly be drastic. The District, by law, must submit a balanced budget to the State to receive state funding.

Community information sessions are being held to bring awareness across the Shoreline and Lake Forest Park communities to the budget challenges the school district is facing. Superintendent Susana Reyes will continue to share information about the financial situation of the district, the contributing factors, and our need to rebalance revenue and expenditures for the 2023-24 school year and beyond. Action Needed:

Many community members are looking for ways to take action to ensure that the School Board knows what is important as they finalize next year's budget.

- 1.) Testify at a School Board Meeting In 3 minutes or less, share an important message as they decide how to cut the School District budget.
- 2.) Write School Board Members Write a less-than-one-page/300-word letter or email to School Board Members that will help their decision-making process related to the budget cuts.
- 3.) Testify at the State Legislature in Olympia The Washington State Legislature began meeting on January 9 and is scheduled to meet for 105 days.
 - 4.) Attend School Board or Budget Advisory Team Meeting
