**North San Luis Obispo County Community Emergency Response Teams (CERTs)
to Recognize PG&E for its Support at Paso Robles ‘SAFETYFest,’ Aug. 20**

WHAT Safety is Pacific Gas and Electric Company’s most important responsibility – for our customers, our communities and employees. We are proud to serve as a sponsor of the inaugural North San Luis Obispo County SAFETYFest, scheduled to be held on Saturday, Aug. 20, 2022, in Paso Robles’ Downtown City Park (west of Pine Street, between 11th and 12th Streets)

A representative of the North SLO County Community Emergency Response Teams (CERTs) is scheduled to make a formal presentation at SAFETYFest to PG&E, formally recognizing the utility for its financial support in recent years, including a \$10,000 grant here in 2022. The local CERTs utilize PG&E funds to promote community awareness of their mission, as well as support training, equipment procurement and offset operational costs. Teresa Alvarado, PG&E vice president, South Bay & Central Coast Region, will represent the utility at the presentation ceremony.

North SLO County CERTs include volunteer organizations not only in North County, but also (Lake) Nacimiento area; Cambria; Estero Bay (Morro Bay, Los Osos and Cayucos); and South County.

WHEN SAFETYFest is scheduled for Saturday, Aug. 20, 2022. A Welcome Ceremony is scheduled to begin at 10:30 a.m.; with the North SLO County CERTs’ presentation to PG&E expected to happen at about 11:30 a.m.

WHO John Spooner, volunteer program director of North SLO County CERTs, is scheduled to make the presentation to PG&E. PG&E Region Vice President Teresa Alvarado will represent the utility.
