

Did you know...?

Did you know MIAFG has been holding its annual convention since 1973? That's five decades of sharing experience, strength and hope in a vibrant, encouraging, educational, and welcoming atmosphere.





Here are some fun facts about our conventions:

- Conventions averaged 445 attendees from 1992 to 2019.
- The high attendance was in 1992 at 850 members.
- Conventions take two years to plan.
- Our MIAFG conventions are put on solely by MIAFG members.
- Convention sessions have included Alateen speakers and panels.
- We usually invite a speaker from outside of Michigan to bring a fresh perspective to our program.
- Conventions have been held in 19 different cities around the state: Ann Arbor, Bay City, Bellaire, Boyne Falls, Detroit, East Lansing, Flint, Gaylord, Grand Rapids, Harbor Springs, Kalamazoo, Lansing, Livonia, Midland, Novi, Pontiac, Traverse City, Troy, and Ypsilanti.
- It has been held most often in Bellaire.
- The convention has been held three times by Zoom, due to the Covid-19 pandemic.
- There are 12 different positions on the convention committee to take care of the many aspects of the meeting.
- Our conventions typically feature a guest speaker, workshops, speaker panels, and an AA speaker – a range of opportunities to share the program.
- MIAFG conventions also have featured entertainment, a literature table, uplifting themes, a dinner banquet, and fellowship opportunities.
- Volunteering to help with a convention is a great way to participate in service to Al-Anon.
- Al-Anon held its first stand-alone international convention in 1985. Before that, Al-Anon's conventions were part of the international AA conventions, held every five years starting in 1950.
- In 2019, MIAFG members voted to change our conventions to a one-day event. Prior to 2022, conventions were a three-day event.
- Many sessions are recorded and tapes of the event can be purchased.

TREASURER

Our account balances, based on bank statements, as of October 31, 2022 are:

Checking	\$ 38,764.97
Reserve	\$ 20,004.55
Convention	\$ 3,919.08
Total	\$ 62,688.60

Our primary source of income this year continues to come from member and group donations. We have received \$16,312 which is 18.7% higher than a year ago (\$13,742). Our In-Kind donations have increased 344.7% from 2021, mostly because we have had an increase in expenses and those receiving reimbursements donate some of their costs. Expenses continue to return to pre-COVID numbers. Since the August meeting we have paid for two *Serenity* Sentinels, the Spring Appeal letter, seed money for the 2023 convention, coordinator expenses for both August AWSC and Fall Assembly, and our WSO guest at Fall Assembly. Our Total Income is \$16,867 which is up 19% and Total Expenses are \$13,981 which is up 724%. The Net Ordinary Income is \$2,886 compared to \$12,470 in 2021, reflecting a change of -77%. This information can be found on the Profit & Loss Report.

During the months of November and December, we will have additional expenses. These include our liability insurance, 2023 WSC Conference payment, and AWSC expenses incurred November 12. There are some potential expenses such as one more *Serenity Sentinel*, Fall Appeal letter, software/hardware costs and a donation to WSO.

Thank you to all members, groups, districts, and AIS offices that have sent in donations. Without your donations, we would not be in the good shape that we currently are in. Please carefully check over the group donations report and inform me of any discrepancies. Remind your groups to include as much information as possible, especially their WSO number, Meeting Location Zip Code and Group Name on their check, as this ensures correct documentation. We continue to accept *PayPal donations via our website (www.miafg.org)*. Please use the Note area to indicate group information.

ARCHIVES

Processing of loose documents continues to be the focus of my work. This consists of removing paper clips and staples; removing items from plastic sleeves or placing them in plastic sleeves, according to filing needs; placing grouped items in chronological order, then filing them.

- 1. Progress with the archives
 - Filed all loose documents of individual MIAFG Groups into existing binders for group records
 - Created catalogue entries for:
 - o Records Coordinator
 - o Group and District documents
 - o Audio cassette tapes
 - Video cassette tapes
 - o Photograph albums
 - o Posters
- 2. Update on previous reports
 - Revised the Group and District Archives Guidelines and sent to the Policy Committee for review
- 3. Money spent none
- 4. Research requests
 - A member of the Wednesday afternoon Serenity group in Port Huron (#6927) asked for information on the history of District 26. They planned a 50year celebration for September 28 and wanted to know if they were the oldest group in District 26. I found records of groups founded 1952-1972 and a document confirming their founding date of September 27, 1972, but nothing definitive on the longest active group in the district. This research revealed gaps in our archives as well as ambiguous dates on early groups.

- 5. New business
 - Acquisitions
 - Received our first acquisition (other than the *Serenity Sentinel* and regular reports)

 a file of skits done by District 3 for their mini-conferences. This is a vibrant addition to the Groups/Districts section of the archives.

- Flier from Tuesday PM AFG in Muskegon (#60392) for their Grill n Chill picnic in September
- Donation from Serenity AFG in Spring Lake (#54576) (my home group) of 12 older copies of *The Forum* to fill in the collection
- Created a finding aid alpha list of Districts by cities; shared with Board and Coordinators
- The Grill n Chill Picnic held by the Tuesday PM AFG (#60392) planned to do a literature swap (bring ones you don't want, pick up ones you do), so I gave flyers to the group to post at the event asking for donations to the archives.
- Created a tri-fold for display at Assemblies explaining some of the work of the archives
- Displayed several archives items at the June Assembly – 1) copy of *Lois Remembers* with Lois's original manuscript signature on the end leaf, 2) the group notebook from 1959 for a Chesaning group, 3) a 1969 publication from the Detroit Area Al-Anon Council, and 4) an early (1974) issue of The *Serenity Sentinel*.
- The "Top Ten Reasons Archives are Cool" piece that I created for the Archives Corner that was published in the Fall 2021 issue of the *Serenity Sentinel* (Panel 61, Issue #3) was chosen by Joe T, WSO Archivist, to be pinned to the AFG Archives Community thread; several Area archivists have said they plan to use it in their archives promotions.
- 6. Fun Discoveries
 - A page from a timeline of Michigan Group history produced by the WSO Archives lists four groups founded in 1952: Benton Harbor, Escanaba, Muskegon, Appleton
 - The registration form for MIAFG's first convention in 1973 – a typed letter, rather than a form. Cost of the dinner was \$6.50.

I am learning so much about Michigan Al-Anon history who we were, how we grew, how we worked with the WSO. I continue to be impressed by the volume of work carried out by our past trusted servants and how the simple task of carrying the message blossoms into meaningful collaborative work across numerous levels of service. I learn more and more about Al-Anon principles from the correspondence with various WSO offices as well as from the emails among MIAFG trusted servants. The archives continues to be a rich source of inspiration for me, filling me with gratitude for the Al-Anon program and the volunteers who went before me.


