## STOOP DOWN; RAISE UP

I am looking at lectionary texts for next Sunday. The reading from Psalm 113 caught my attention. From verses 5-7 comes these words: "who is like the Lord our God, who stoops down to look on the heavens and the earth, and raises the poor from the dust and lifts the needy . . ." The psalmist produces the image of God both stooping down to see our needs and raising us up from the depths of our despair. What a wondrous picture! I am reminded of the words from an old hymn, "stoop to my weakness, mighty as thou art."

There are some things in life that we think are beneath us, we wouldn't stoop that low. Yet, our gracious God has and is and will not only bend to see us in our need, but also raise us up to new heights. If this is who our God is, are we not challenged to do likewise? To stoop down and raise up? I am not inclined to bend down to pick up a penny but would absolutely stoop to pick up a hundred dollar bill, because I know the value of the currency. God sees the value of all people and therefore is willing to reach them and raise them. What if you and I considered the value of those around us and began the practice of stooping down and raising up. Just a thought from Psalm 113.
