

How to get in (and out of) your Corvette

We all need a reminder occasionally about safety measures built into our cars for those rare occasions when the battery fails and we're stuck in or out of our Corvettes.

All recent generations of Corvettes have electronic door release switches. If the battery were to fail while you are



inside the car, the door release button will not work. Just pull the emergency door release lever next to both seats.

If you are locked out, you can open the rear hatch or trunk by pulling the key from your fob, insert it into the keyhole above the rear license plate and turn to open the hatch or trunk. There is an emergency door release cable on the left (driver's) side to open the left door.



Cascade Corvette Club Touring Etiquette

It has been requested that we print a "refresher" regarding some touring rules and suggestions for when we are travelling as a group. These points are made with the understanding that they are to keep us safe on the road and not as punitive measures. As we all know, traffic and speeds on our highways have gone up drastically and road trips (especially on I-5) can be an "adventure".

As the person leading many cruises for the last 30+ years, I feel I have earned the right to add some personal comments to a couple of these thoughts.

- Please do not pass the Corvette in front of you, unless you are instructed to do so. If you pass the leader, you just became the leader, hope you know where you're going.
- 2. Keep up with the Corvette in front of you. If you fall behind and then try to catch up it has a rubber band effect.
- 3. Drive at a safe distance, don't tailgate.
- 4. When on a freeway, we will be driving 70-72 mph in the right lane to permit other to pass our group. This is a tough one. As everyone knows, the average speed on I-5 now is more like 75-80. Even the trucks are doing 70+ which make it extremely dicey to try and maintain a cruise-control speed and pass. There are two distinct thoughts on how this should be handled everyone in line jumps to the left lane at one time or each car moves to the left lane when they approach the vehicle they want to pass. When we all move to the left at once, we become a rolling roadblock for those behind us who want to drive 80. Rather than endorse either passing method, I am more inclined to say "You do what you think is safest". This is why we try to stay off I-5 as much as possible!
- 5. In case of car trouble, flash your headlights several times and pull to the shoulder. One or two cars should pull over with you to help. In addition, use your radio or cell phone to let the leader know what is happening.
- 6. Bring your Talk-About 2-way radios. CCC uses channel 6.0.
- 7. When turning onto another road, the last Corvette should <u>try</u> to slow or wait until the next group of cars catch up and see where to turn. This is another one that should ONLY be done when it is safe to do.
