Holiday Farm Fire Benefit Car Show

When we first came up with the idea for the Holiday Farm Fire Cruise-In we had no idea what the response would be and it turns out we had a great surprise. It is estimated there were 150+ cars and trucks; it is difficult to give an exact number as there was not a pre-registration – just a cruise-in. There was no registration fee, or trophies, or raffle prizes as it was our hope participants would instead donate to the two charities we were hosting. While there was not food available in the parking area, there were many options available in the Valley River Center area. Boy Scout Troop 182 sold ice cold water and we heard they had a successful fundraiser. McKenzie River Fire & Rescue in conjunction with the U.S. Forest Service had a booth and was glad to talk about defensive spaces around homes especially with the recent fire activity.

With the help of Valley River Center donating a parking lot and the corporate sponsorship from Lithia Toyota of Springfield, Kendall Auto Group, Jerry's Home Center Eugene & Springfield, Oregon Community Credit Union, the generous participants of the cruise-in, and members of the public, we were able to present 100% of the contributions: \$7,000 to McKenzie River Fire & Rescue Volunteer Association and \$7,000 to One Hope/Sheds of Hope.

The McKenzie River Fire & Rescue Volunteer Association has a handle on what is needed by those who have suffered great loss from the Holiday Farm Fire. That could be in housing, clothing, medical supplies, food, etc. Because they also live along the McKenzie River, they are working to help their neighbors. One Hope/Sheds of Hope have developed partnerships with local agencies and have a list of landowners who have been approved to start to rebuild. A shed is the first structure on their property, a place to store tools, a shelter from the rain on work days, a first step to rebuilding. To date they have coordinated the building of 89 sheds, 40 more have received approval and are waiting for a shed to be built. Those interested in working with a group to build a shed will be paired with a "coach", receive a pre-fab shed kit, and then assemble the shed on a landowner's property. 


Brothers Car Collection





YAY!! Michelin All Season 4 ZP tires are now becoming available in C7 Grand Sport and ZO6 sizes. GRIS GS will have new shoes this week!

This new version of the all-season tire has been available in sizes to fit "most" Corvettes, offering longer tread life, better wet grip and the ability to drive in colder temperatures.

One of the most commonly asked questions regarding tires on Corvette Forum is "what tire pressure should I run in my C7 (or 6 or 5 or 4....). The answer is on a tag in your driver's side door sill. With one exception, GM has steadfastly recommended 30 psi cold. For a very short time, only a couple of months, some tags read 32 psi. Those were quickly replaced by 30 psi. Please don't be confused by the "maximum inflation" reading on the side of your tires. The 51 psi you see there is the maximum allowed and will lead to catastrophic failure of the tire.





Mid Engine Monthly Update: Major New C8 News (John Elegant)

Chevy officially confirmed the C8 Z06 will be revealed this fall as a 2023 model. They also shared its emblem and a video of its flat plane crank DOHC motor.. There is more info here including a link to the sound clip they revealed; listen to it scream in the 8,000 to 9,000 RPM range when wound out:

We are oh so close to the 2022's starting to be officially ordered. Dealers have gotten their allocations for the beginning of the 2022 production cycle and customer orders will have been matched with those allocations, and now or within a week those orders will have become at least status 2000, meaning formally GM accepted, with a GM com-

mitment to build that specifically optioned vehicle for that specific customer. Best information we have to date is that the 2021 model year will end production the week of September 6th and that the 2022's production would start immediately afterwards. However, might the 2021 ending September 6th production week slip one more — for GM has committed in writing that they will build every status 3000, 2021 Stingray? That is yet unknown.

Tracking C8 production so far, the 2020 model year Bowling Green Assembly (BGA) plant created 21,626 vehicles and while the exact number of 2021's is not yet known, we believe it will be around 26,750. Estimates for 2022 production vary all over. My best calculation is that we will see around 31,000 C8 Stingray's produced, and perhaps/hopefully that number could even be 33,000 units. How come 2022 will not in all probability be a 40,000 unit year that we all desire? The sad answer which we just received from Tadge Juechter is that 2022 will have production issues also, for as fast as supply chain problems are resolved, our remembering that there are 400+ unique C8 suppliers, those suppliers will continue to suffer their own supply chain interruptions, e.g., in their getting their ingredient components necessary to make C8 parts that they then ship to BGA. Tadge noted that "as soon as we solve one supply chain issue, another one unfortunately comes up," calling this BGA's daily "Whack-A-Mole." More information at the link, but while IMO while production of C8's is going up year after year (thankfully), 2022 will not be one "green light." There is one more compounding issue for we have known for a while that GM wants to return to its traditional ending of the Corvette production year just before the July 4th weekend, giving BGA employees that holiday week off, combining it with retooling for the next model year, and then starting the new year's production roughly around the middle of July. If this were to again happen, this would be the third production-length-shortened C8 year in a row.

GM also committed that at its reveal event they will share the Z06's availability once it starts to be manufactured (again which we currently BELIEVE would be around August or September of next year).

In the interim, we are all so fortunate to have Corvettes to drive for as we all know, it does not matter which one(s) we have, but that we are lucky to have one to drive at all. Please be safe and enjoy your many miles of Corvette driving smiles.
