# Your regularly scheduled President's Message

First, a heartfelt "Thank you" to Simone Thomas for the incredible work she has done with the club website! Have you seen it yet? Stop reading right now and go to <u>www.cascadecorvetteclub.com</u> and see for yourself!

Congratulations to David & Christine Kopachik who just bought a 2014 Night Race Blue Stingray coupe with Kalahari interior.

David asked a question about their new Corvette that put me back on the path to one of my personal quests - to address the issue of tire age. Their 2014 has tires dated "3113" - 31st week of 2013, so they are almost exactly 6 years old. It is my opinion, backed up by Michelin, that the normal life expectancy of tires is 6 years. Even if the tread is still good, the rubber compound itself has begun to harden. This will directly impact the amount of traction that tire will be able to maintain, especially on wet or cool road surfaces. Some of you may remember our spin in Dallas, OR on 6 year old Goodyears. I now replace tires at 5 years (if they last that long).

# June 25, 1985 is a date I suspect most of you won't recognize. I know I didn't before I read the following article. Hope you enjoy it as much as I did. Other historic details might surprise you too.

After 59 years, the iconic route 66 entered the realm of history on this day in 1985, when the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials decertifies the road and votes to remove all of its highway signs.

Measuring some 2200 miles in its heyday, Route 66 stretched from Chicago, Illinois to Santa Monica California, passing through eight states. According to a New York Times article about its decertification, most of Route 66 followed a path through the wilderness forged in 1857 by U S Navy Lieutenant Edward Beale at the head of a caravan of camels. Over the years, wagon trains and cattlemen eventually made way for trucks and passenger automobiles.

The idea of building a highway along this route surfaced in Oklahoma in the mid-1920's as a way to link the state to cities like Chicago and Los Angeles. Highway Commissioner Cyrus S Avery touted it as a way of diverting traffic from Kansas City, Missouri and Denver. In 1926, the highway earned its official designation as Route 66.

The diagonal course of Route 66 linked hundreds of mostly rural communities to the cities along its route, allowing farmers to more easily transport grain and other types of produce for distribution. The highway was also a lifeline for the long-distance trucking industry, which by 1930 was competing with the railroad for dominance in the shipping market. Route 66 was the scene of a mass westward migration during the 1930's, when more than 200,000 people traveled from the poverty stricken Dust Bowl to California. John Steinbeck immortalized the highway, which he called the "Mother Road," in his classic 1939 novel *The Grapes of Wrath.* 

Beginning in the 1950's, the building of a massive system of interstate highways made older roads increasingly obsolete, and by 1970, modern four-lane highways had bypassed nearly all sections of Route 66. In October, 1984, Interstate 40 bypassed the last original stretch of Route 66 at Williams, Arizona, and the following year the road was decertified. According to the national Historic Route 66 Federation, drivers can still use 85% of the road, and Route 66 has become a destination for tourists from all over the world.

Often called the "Main Street of America," Route 66 became a pop culture mainstay over the years, inspiring its own song (written in 1947 by Bobby Troup, "Route 66" was later recorded by artists as varied as Nat King Cole, Chuck Berry and the Rolling Stones) as well as a 1960's television series. More recently, the historic highway was featured prominently in the hit animated film "Cars."

Our new 2019 Grand Sport had less than 1600 miles when I took it to my favorite alignment shop for a complete fourwheel alignment. You may think that is obsessive and overly cautious, but have you priced new tires recently? Grand Sports and ZO6's come from the assembly plant with a very aggressive alignment. Stingrays are not as aggressive, but... the GM alignment specs are very wide. Meaning the alignment numbers can still be "within specs", but will eat a set of tires in short order. To my surprise the front specs were not bad (but still needed to be tweaked), but the rear toe alignment was WAY off. After all this was corrected the car drives SO MUCH better! Have your alignment checked - anything in red needs to be corrected.
