My Day at Glass on the Grass

The clipboard that caused wailing, gnashing of teeth, anxiety and almost ruined my day!

My day started like many other Corvette road trip days, loading the 2019 convertible with all the things we would need for a Corvette show – cleaning products, two chairs, one clip-on umbrella, PNW Caravan advertising items, cooler, first aid kit....you get the idea. A <u>lot</u> to stuff into the trunk of a C7 Corvette. Nancy likes to keep a clipboard in the trunk for rallies and filling out any documents we may need to finish. The clipboard was in an awkward spot, so I found a convenient slot to fit it into.

When we arrived at Brooks, we began our usual setup procedure – set up chairs and cooler, spread out the PNW Caravan information and put the top down. The hatch came up, the top folded down into it's place and the hatch began closing. That's when the sound of my happy little world came crashing down on our ears. *Crunch...Snap... BANG*

The hatch was sitting at an odd angle, passenger side higher than the driver's side and would not move up or down. The drivers side would move, but the passenger side was jammed solid. Life stopped!

I called two local Chevrolet dealers for help, one doubted they could get a tech to look at it, the other didn't even bother to call back. (I will remember that) So we headed to Stayton with the top down and the hatch up about one inch from closing. When we arrived, sure enough, they didn't have a tech to look at the issue, but offered to keep the car until they had one sometime next week. Umm...NO! Good thing because I would have felt even MORE stupid if I had to pay for this. While we sat there pondering what to do, the Sales Manager came out and tried to sell me a 70th Anniversary they had on the floor.
