#### July Presidents Message

Hi everybody,

The last few months I have been writing with a focus on military matters. As the 4<sup>th</sup> of July is upon us, I thought it would be a good idea to investigate the roots of one of our club's long-time traditions of reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

There have been several re-writes of the pledge, the first being penned by Colonel George Balch in 1885 which read "We give our heads and our hearts to God and our country: one country, one language, one flag."

In 1892 Francis Bellamy was tasked with writing a new pledge to use in celebrations commemorating the 400<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Columbus in the new world. He penned an oath that read "I pledge allegiance to my flag and the republic for which it stands, one nation, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

During 1923 and 1924, the National Flag Conference changed the wording to read "I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America." In 1942, Congress officially adopted the pledge and decided that it should be recited while holding the right hand over the heart. In 1954 the next revision to the pledge came after lobbying by both religious and fraternal organizations and with support from President Eisenhower. Congress passed a bill adding the words "under God". Despite occasional legal challenges from various groups, the text has since remained unchanged.

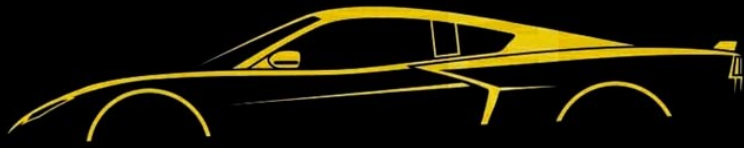


**July 30 - National Corvette Day**

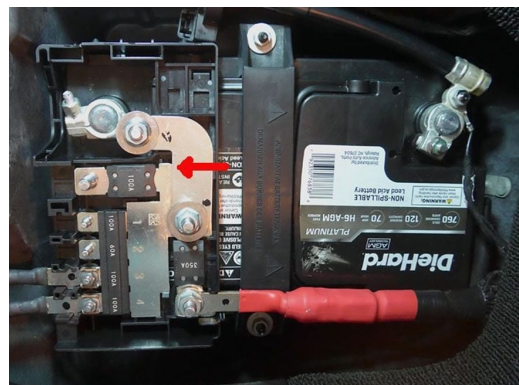


### C7 Electrical Gremlins

The following is from a post by "Avanti" on CorvetteForum. He recently changed the battery in his C7 and lost all electrical power. "Avanti" is an experienced auto enthusiast, but this problem had him stumped.

Today I started checking the voltage at various places starting with the positive post on the battery, after making sure it and its cable connector were at 12.6. As I moved along the "L" shaped stainless piece the voltage dropped to 0.3 and was the same at the underlying plate and everywhere else. BUT, as I pushed down on the voltmeter probe at the place marked by a red arrow in the picture below, it sparked! So, I had my wife come out and hold the meter and negative probe while I pushed down on the L-plate and two things happened: 1) the voltage went up everywhere as I pressed and checked and 2) for the first time the inside lights came on. WOW!

So, I'd found the problem. I took the advice of several here and tried tightening the nuts more... no joy. Then, it was obvious that the L-plate simply was bowed slightly. I had no idea it was that "soft." What a poor design since I'd been especially careful with it. I took it off--yet again-- and slightly bowed it down at the elbow. I then cleaned it with 1500-grit sand-paper and contact-cleaner and reinstalled. But, to try and better distribute the pressure from the two nuts I added a stainless fender-washer at each, as pictured. NOT a confidence inspiring design, by any means. In fact, I considered making another L-piece from real steel and bowing slightly to bolt on top of the OEM to press the latter down with more force all along. But, that's later if I get stranded.

You are cordially invited to our 2nd Group Run outside club event. Our annual chance to rip through the woods in our favorite fast cars, with a selected group of people, who share the passion of their cars and driving them. And hopefully, if nature cooperates, just before the weather turns, and our summer tires don't grip as well; when the back roads are still roads, and before they change to lichen and moss lined rivers. Either way, it's happening rain or shine, so choose your car as you see fit. Our drive is the same path I've sometimes ridden on my motorcycle. Years past, in the early fall I would leave from Eugene, ride Clear Lake over to Highway 36, through Mapleton and eventually finish in Old Town Florence. We'll follow this road until it ends at Territorial Highway, and then we'll go straight onto Lawrence Road, and follow this over to Highway 36. After this, we stay on Highway 36 all the way into Mapleton. From there, continuing on our way into Florence, and down into Old Town. Finally ending at River Roasters Coffee Shop in Old Town Florence.

Once there we can share a coffee, talk cars, or whatever, (I'm not your dad), and then disperse as we like. You can return the way we came on Highway 36 or use the quicker Highway 126 to get home.
