7th Generation Production Notes

For the last two years the Corvette community has been consumed with news of the up-coming 8th Generation Mid-Engine Corvette. Let's take a moment to review the short but successful run of the C7. Thanks to Keith Cornett of "Corvetteblogger" for all the following information.

Bowling Green produced a total of 189,507 official production Corvettes between the 2014 and 2019 model years. The highest total came in 2016 when 40,689 'Vettes found new homes. 2018 was an extremely shortened model year that only saw 9,670 Corvettes built, the lowest number since 1959.

Overall production neared the previous generation's final count of 215,125 and the C6 was built for three model years longer.

Arctic White was the most popular overall color at 35,936 produced followed by Black at 31,084 and Torch Red with 29,758. The other color that was available through the entire production run, Blade Silver, eked out a fourth-place finish (10,954 total). Even though it was only available in 2015 and 2016, Shark Gray found itself on 5.37% of all C7s (10,174). Next up with a final tally of 9,881 is Laguna Blue. Lowest production colors were: Lime Rock Green - 1566 (0.83%), Black Rose - 1552 (0.82%) and Sterling Blue - 921 (0.49%).

The Supercharged Corvette Z06 debuted in 2015 and a total of 39,940 Z06s were built in the five-year run. 2016 was the peak year for Z06 production with 14,275 leaving the factory. Through the eight years of C6 Z06 production (three more than C7 Zs), a total of 27,994 were sold. Even with five additional years of the more comparable C6 ZR1 and the one year only 427 Convertible, the C7 Z06 outsold all performance variants of the C6 by 4,710 cars!

Between 2017 and 2019, Chevrolet produced a total of 26,280 C7 Grand Sports (21,977 Coupes and just 4,303 Convertibles). During this span, the widebody LT1 was the second most purchased 'Vette after the Stingray which sold 31,045 units (120,334 total Stingrays were produced for the C7 Generation (25,805 of which were drop tops)). The most difficult hue to find on a Grand Sport is, unsurprisingly Sterling Blue. A paltry 402 orders included the silvery shade of blue during its limited production run in 2017. After Sterling Blue are Black Rose (543), Elkhart Lake Blue (782), and Corvette Racing Yellow (885). The only other colors that have less than 1000 examples in circulation are Sebring Orange at 896 and Shadow Gray with 956. (Editor's Note: Of the 4303 GS convertibles built, only 86 are Shadow Gray:)

Of the nearly 200,000 C7s produced, the total take-rate for manual transmissions was 50,611 or 26.55%. The low-sounding percentage is one of the talking points that Tadge & Co use to justify their switch to a one transmission strategy on the C8.

As far as Chrome vs. Black wheels go; after a relatively close couple of years, Black wheels ended up winning the war. Not only did they outsell Chromies 88,131 to 56,880 but the Corvette Team decided that the mid-engine 2020 Corvette was the time to put reflective wheels out to pasture with flip-up lights and carburetors.

No matter what your thoughts are on these topics, one thing is for sure. The C7 leaves behind a legacy as the zenith of front-engine Corvettes, highly sought after by traditional Corvette enthusiasts for decades to come.
