Headspace Film Block - March 7 9:15 am (length 1:16)
With Grace: Grace, a witty 13-year-old girl, with big dreams and the rare gift of making everyone around her laugh, takes us back to her early childhood years with her close-knit, loving farmer family in Kenya: a time with lots of fun, but also a time when disaster almost split her family apart.
Millennial Dad: Jo, a first time, self-doubting millennial dad is determined to break his family's legacy of absent fathers. For the first time ever, Jo is left alone with his adorable yet demanding baby while juggling an urgent work deadline that's also the opportunity of a lifetime. Jo struggles to connect with his little one amidst the chaos and pressure.
Black Rose: A former MMA fighter gets a second shot at her dream career, but she must choose between her family and her destiny.
The Language of Light: Jacqueline Mitelman: Jacqueline Mitelman is a portrait photographer who has lived and worked in Melbourne apart from a period living in France. A wide range of private commissions has resulted in an extensive collection of portraits of culturally significant Australians, described as fusing the intensity of the moment with stillness of icons (Dr Vivien Gaston).

Elegant Dead: Trapped with Dolls: Is a Southern gothic film inspired by The Haunted Guide to New Orleans. Told by two ghostly narrators, the short film moves between two haunting tales: Alice, a house sitter tormented by demonic dolls in a New Orleans mansion, and a spectral Lady in White reliving a dangerous romantic encounter at a Victorian party. Blending atmosphere, suspense, and the supernatural, the film pays tribute to the haunted beauty of New Orleans and asks: In a world of shadows, who is truly alive—and who is already dead?

Silent Control: Struggling with anxiety, a woman turns to ASMR for relief only to fall under its hypnotic grip, committing a crime she doesn't remember. Detectives race to uncover the details, unaware of being manipulated by someone closer to home.

24 Days Without You: When a routine childbirth turns into a life-threatening emergency, one mother's world is forever changed. This film follows Annie's harrowing experience with Amniotic Fluid Embolism, a rare and often fatal complication that strikes without warning. Told in her own voice and through the perspectives of her family and care team, the film offers an unflinching look at the clinical, emotional, and relational aftermath of surviving the unimaginable.

Shambhala Story: In the Himalayan town of Darjeeling, India, the devout Tibetan monk, Tashi, is sent to Japan for further studies. There, he befriends a violent elderly man and his parolee granddaughter, Emi, who are both struggling to make ends meet. As the loneliness they all share brings them closer to Tashi, forbidden feelings between him and Emi emerge. Can Tashi avoid losing himself in the impossible choice between his love for a woman and his promise to his religion?
