Documentary Feature - March 9 9:15 am - Saturday

Laila Nadene: This film takes viewers on a raw journey through the life of Laila, a woman in her late 40s who is callously served with divorce papers on her 25th wedding anniversary while her husband announces his intentions to wed a new woman, Nadene. But soon after the marriage begins, Nadene realizes her new husband's dark side, and she soon discovers she has married a full-blown sociopath. Despite beginning to overcome the traumas of her past, Laila teams up with Nadene as the two set out to find justice for the victims, help each other heal, and prevent the destruction of their futures. **Viewer Discretion: domestic violence.**

Just One Life: After the death of her mother, Asian American violinist Renee moves to Kentucky where she meets Sam, a Christian astronomer, and reluctantly falls in love. Along the way, she struggles to overcome life's sudden tragedies and find faith to not only survive, but to create meaning by impacting just one life.

Requiem for a River: This film explores the New Mexico stretch of the Rio Grande — an iconic but endangered American waterway — in a time of climate change and calls for environmental justice. Through lyrical imagery and in-depth interviews with a diverse range of residents — Native, Latino, Indo-Hispanic and Anglo — this visually poetic documentary reveals the once-mighty river's role as a lifeline in the desert and asks whether the keys to a more sustainable, equitable future lie in New Mexico's ancient past.

Virago: A nomad mother fights to bring new life into the world. Viewer Discretion: mature audience.

The Key: After clashing with bullies, a Dublin schoolgirl goes on a spiritual quest through a local long forgotten Druid's portal. She can't return until she finds the key - which is forgiveness. **Viewer Discretion:** suicide, bullying.

42 Seconds: Months after a mass shooting at a small town diner, the only survivors revisit the scene with hopes of healing from their shared trauma. A single moment can last forever. *Viewer Discretion: mature audience.*

Strange World: A prostitute who does not know love discovers it in a night with a suicidal man. *Viewer Discretion:* sex, *nudity*, *suicide*

Long Live the Dead: Funerals are at the heart of Ghanaian culture and social life. Among the Frafra people in northern Ghana, funerals are an opportunity to celebrate life! Troubadour Stevo Atambire is a musician who travels from funeral to funeral comforting the relatives and friends of the deceased person. With his improvised songs, using a traditional Kologo guitar, Stevo sings about the life of the deceased and assists family members in parting from their loved one. It is Stevo's mission to spread his culture's music and values worldwide. The film aims to reinforce this mission by showing how important music and rituals can be for a community, in good as well as in bad times. Viewer Discretion: mature audience, death.

Breathe: Tormented by the noises in his head, a troubled young man decides to face up to his recent past, against the wishes of those around him.

From the Dark: Laura, a quite shy and introverted thirteen year old teen, embarks on a dark journey to gain freedom from her worst enemy: Her own self.

La Voix Des Autres (The Voice of Others): Rim is a Tunisian interpreter working in France on asylum procedures. Every day, she translates the stories of exiled men and women, whose voices raise questions about her own history.
