Through honoring animals in their life cycle and the gifts they give us after death, we learn about the profound role feathers play in Native American cultural identity. This film celebrates the gifts of urban wildlife in our lives and our understanding of the world around us.

## Justice For All - Film Block - March 8 9:20 pm - Friday

Do Over - A middle-aged woman with more than a few regrets revisits an important part of her past to try and right a wrong, only to find that not everyone remembers the past the same way.
Who She Is: Abbi. Sheila. Jocelyn. Lela. These are women hidden within the statistics of Murdered and Missing Indigenous Women epidemic. Meet them. See them. Say their names. They are "Who She Is". This film tells the story of two women caught in the Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women (MMIW) epidemic in the U.S. By bringing these missing women to life on screen, through animation and first-person storytelling, the documentary aims to humanize the people behind the statistics of MMIW.
Free Lover: This film is based on an incredible true story. A young woman's childhood vision motivates her to pursue the US presidency, but exposing the secrets of a prominent preacher leads to disastrous consequences. The year is 1870 and Victoria Woodhull is the first woman to be nominated to run for US President before women had the right to vote.
