A Fresh Look for Our Community Power Washing Update

Residents, thank you for sharing your feedback! In the past, power washing wasn't always included in our maintenance schedule and often fell to residents. We decided that wasn't fair, so this year we made it a priority to help keep our community looking beautiful, clean, and welcoming.

Because of our smaller staff and years of deferred maintenance — especially behind homes — **the work is taking longer than expected**. While that slowed us down on front porches, we are now refocusing to complete them this fall. Patios, sides, and backs of homes (some untouched for years) will continue into next year. We'll resume in spring/summer to bring everything to the new standard and maintain it consistently moving forward.

Thank you for your patience and understanding as we work to keep our community a place we can all be proud of.

Quick Summary:

**** Preventive Maintenance Update**

- Our team is currently **cleaning dryer vents** in the apartments and will continue throughout the community. This improves energy efficiency and reduces the risk of fire.
- We've also started flushing water heaters, which will now be part of the annual maintenance schedule. Regular flushing helps extend the life of the heaters and keeps them running their best.

Preventive maintenance is an important step in protecting our homes and ensuring everything runs smoothly for years to come. Thank you for your cooperation as we move through these projects!

Here are a few simple things you can add to *your own* **personal checklist this season**:

- Clean dryer lint traps (clean w/each use) & around machines – helps efficiency and safety.
- **Flip/rotate mattresses** keeps them in better shape.
- **Check flashlight batteries** handy for winter storms.
- Clean out medicine cabinets safely dispose of expired items.

- 1985 The wreck of the Titanic was discovered on the ocean floor.




