
Celebrating the Value of Life at Buchert Ridge Community

If you use needles, syringes, or other medical supplies at home, please dispose of them safely:

- **Sharps** (like needles and lancets) should go in a sturdy, puncture-proof container with a tight lid. Label it "Do Not Recycle", and seal it before placing in household trash—never flush or place loosely in the bin.
- Used bandages, gloves, or dressings should be double-bagged in plastic and securely tied before disposal.

Courtesy Reminders from Our Facilities Team



Our Facilities Staff work hard to help keep the community clean, comfortable, and running smoothly. Here are a couple of friendly reminders to help them (and all of us!) out:

- **Shoe Covers on Request** Out of respect for your home, our Facilities Team carries protective shoe coverings in their vehicles. If you'd prefer they wear them when entering your home, just let them know—they're happy to accommodate your request.
- **Trash** Please tie your trash bags before placing garbage in the dumpsters or trash bins, please make sure your bags are securely tied. Loose or open bags often spill during disposal, creating a mess our team then needs to clean up. A quick tie goes a long way in keeping the area tidy for everyone.
- Avoid Suction Cup Bath Mats For the care and longevity of your tub, please do not use suction cup
 bath mats—they can damage or strip the tub's finish over time. If you need a
 non-slip option, alternative mats that don't rely on suction cups are
 recommended and available from various retailers.




Our first two movies were a huge hit! Grab a friend (and maybe a seat cushion!) and join us this month!


Two unlikely friends embark on a meaningful adventure to make the most of life and check off their dreams—one bucket list item at a time.
