




Daylight Saving Time – Sunday, March 9 Be sure to set your clocks AHEAD one hour.

Monthly Maintenance & Service Fee Rates

As discussed at the Annual Financial Meeting on January 28th, there will be a 7% **increase** *on each line item* of your invoice for the monthly maintenance and service fee beginning April 1, 2025.

If your arrangement is such that your bank sends a check on your behalf, please inform them of the new amount. If you take advantage of the auto withdrawal process to pay your monthly maintenance fee, our Office will inform your bank of the new rate and no further action is required on your part.

Friendly Pet Reminders

Resident Dues - \$3

Dishwasher Detergent

Plumbers recommend Gel Pods (Cascade or Finish pods) over liquid detergents. They do *not* recommend powdered detergents. Since gel pods are pre-measured, they are less likely to leave residue behind, perform better than liquid detergents, and reduce the risk of damaging internal components of the dishwasher. For hard water or to prevent mineral buildup, it is recommended to use a rinse aid.

Maintenance & Grounds Reminders

- Reminder that we begin work which could possibly make noise or necessitate that we enter homes starting at 8:00 AM.
- Safety Reminder: Ovens should *not* be used for storage. Storing items in your oven can create a fire and burn hazard.

Goodwill Ambulance

Reminder: If you sign up for the Goodwill Ambulance, there will be no charge for services. The annual fee is \$65 per person. Renews on July 1st. If you sign up now, the fee is half.



Brown Bag History The Irish in the American Civil War Saturday, March. 1 at 12 Noon

The American Civil War is often referred to as Ireland's forgotten conflict. By 1860, approximately 1.5 million Irish immigrants were living in the United States. During the war, an estimated 150,000 Irishmen served in the Union Army, while around 20,000 fought for the Confederacy. Although exact figures for Irish soldiers who died are unavailable, the number likely reached into the thousands. Sadly, the significant contributions and experiences of these Irish soldiers remain relatively unknown. Join historical reenactor and lecturer Michael Jesberger for a presentation on these "Sons of Erin," who played a pivotal role in the American Civil War.
