

#### WORLD DAY OF THE SICK – FEBRUARY 11<sup>TH</sup>



On February 11<sup>th</sup>, the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, the faithful worldwide are invited to recognize the World Day of the Sick. In

recognition of this day, the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will ONLY be celebrated at this Saturday's 4:00 pm Mass at St. Mother Teresa's and at this Saturday's 4:30 pm Mass at St. Theresa's. We apologize for this change from last week's notice.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that "the Church believes and confesses that among the seven sacraments there is one especially intended to strengthen those who are being tried by illness, the Anointing of the Sick". It is appropriate to receive the Anointing of the Sick for those suffering from a chronic condition detrimental to their health and well-being, and as soon as "anyone from the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age", "just prior to an operation", or "for the elderly whose frailty becomes more pronounced". Through receiving this sacrament, the Holy Spirit will give strength, peace, and courage to help those overcome the difficulties of chronic sickness, serious illness, or old age.

## **HAPPY 75<sup>TH</sup>!**

75 years ago, this Wednesday (February 15<sup>th</sup>), the first Mass was celebrated by the newly formed Parish of St. Catherine of Siena, with Reverend Frank Carroll as Pastor.

World War II brought a great influx of people to Halifax and soon the need for housing became acute, and homes were built in the fast, developing north-west end. It was natural that many of the owners of the new homes were Catholic so in 1948, Archbishop John T. McNally established the Parish community of St. Catherine of Siena. Although a proper Church was a dream for the future, a military chapel (the "Barracks") at the corner of Bayers Road and Oxford Street was leased.

For the first couple of years, the use of the "Barracks" cost the Parish a token \$1.00 per year because a friend of Father Carroll was stationed in Windsor Park and arranged the lease. When the military command changed, the Parish was asked for a rent of \$100 per month in order to continue the lease of the property. Services for the growing Parish were held in the military chapel during those first years, but it was realized that, although it was possible to renew the lease on the chapel for another few years, something must be done about building a proper church. Property was acquired on Bayers Road and in 1950 permission was given to start building. The sod was turned on November 5<sup>th</sup> and the excavation and foundation were finished by the end

of the year. Things did not go as smoothly as hoped and a few challenges were experienced. The Church was not ready for occupancy until 1953, and on September 18<sup>th</sup> of that year, the Blessed Sacrament was taken in procession from the "barracks" to our new home on Bayers Road.

#### HEATING ASSISTANCE REBATE PROGRAM (HARP)



The Nova Scotia government is providing a Heating Assistance Rebate Program that helps low-andmoderate-income Nova

Scotians with the cost of home heating. Rebates are \$1,000 for each household. You can apply until March 31, 2023. For more information, visit:

To qualify for the rebate (based on your 2021 Notice of Assessment), you need to pay for your own home (residential) heat and meet one of the following criteria:

- have a net income of \$85,000 or less and live alone with no kids or dependents;
- have a combined net household income of \$85,000 or less and live with kids, dependents or other adults;
- receive Income Assistance from the Department of Community Services;
- receive the Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS) or the Allowance from Service Canada.

#### A GOOD DEATH: CHALLENGES FOR CATHOLICS TODAY
