

And . . . at one of our Ash Wednesday's evening Masses, Fr. Christopher McKelvie, FoH, read a quote from the **Venerable Don Tonino Bello**:

"Don't give up, but multiply! Lent is the time to make life beautiful. Ashes and water were once the old ingredients for making soap. And so, here is where we begin again: with the desire to make your life beautiful. Yes, your life! The first task is this: rediscover the beauty that you have inside, and that, for some reason or another, you put aside. Lent, then, is the time to multiply. In this time, multiply instead of "giving up"; multiply your time for people, for friends; multiply your acts of love; multiply the good words that do good for the heart. Multiply the time of silence and meditation. Pray, read, and reconsider your life up till now. Love all of the steps that have brought you to today. This is the time to make life beautiful. Don't just give up material things and just be content not to eat sweets, not to smoke, not to write on social media: in this time, you have to work with your heart and understand how to love people. It is the heart that matters. Have a lovely journey!"

LENTEN MESSAGE FROM ARCHBISHOP DUNN



As we prepare to enter the season of Lent, Archbishop Dunn wants to offer a message to the faithful. In his letter, he invites all to reflect on the theme of

reconciliation in light of our relationships with our God, one another, and most specifically with our Mi'kmaq brothers and sisters. In part it reads: *I believe that God has placed in our hearts a call to be reconciled with one another and with the Lord. In fact, this call for reconciliation has been fulfilled in Jesus who emptied himself to show us the desire of God to reconcile us. As a Church, we need to continue to proclaim this message of healing and we need to stand in the midst of any situations which need reconciliation and healing. TURKEY AND SYRIA EARTHQUAKE RELIEF



Archbishop Dunn joins his fellow Canadian Bishops in asking the faithful to donate to the relief efforts being made in the aftermath of the devastating earthquake in

Turkey and Syria. A media release put out by the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops on Friday, February 10th, says:

With the support of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCCB), Aid to Church in Need (ACN), Canadian Jesuits International (CJI), Catholic Near East Welfare Association (CNEWA) Canada, and Development and Peace-Caritas Canada (DPCC) are launching an emergency aid campaign in response to the destructive earthquake that hit Turkey and Syria on Monday. They have pledged the total sum of nearly one million Canadian dollars.

THE PEOPLE OF UKRAINE

1ST ANNIVERSARY OF RUSSIAN INVASION



On Ash Wednesday, Pope Francis, speaking two days before the first anniversary of Russia's invasion of Ukraine, called for a ceasefire and peace negotiations, saying no victory could be "built on ruins".

"May the Lord forgive so many crimes and so much violence. He is the God of peace. Let us remain close to the martyred Ukrainian people who continue to suffer", Pope Francis said.

CLASS ACTION: CLAIMS PERIOD



The Claims period of the class action suit filed against the Archdiocese of Halifax-Yarmouth runs from December 14, 2022 until December 14, 2023. Individuals who wish to

make a claim to receive settlement benefits have 12 months in which they can make a formal claim. See notice below. For more information on this suit, visit www.halifaxyarmouth.org/classaction

This notice was approved by the Supreme Court of Nova Scotia

NOTICE OF SETTLEMENT IN CLASS ACTION

To all individuals who were sexually abused by a priest of the Roman Catholic Episcopal Corporation of Halifax or Roman Catholic Episcopal Corporation of Yarmouth between April 14, 1954 and March 31, 2020 and have not previously settled or otherwise released either the Roman Catholic Episcopal Corporation of Halifax or Roman Catholic Episcopal Corporation of Yarmouth.

The Court has approved a settlement which provides compensation to eligible class members who file a claim for sexual assault and meet the requirements of the claims process.

If you opted out of the class action, the settlement will not impact you.

If you are part of the lawsuit as a Class Member, you can submit a claim for a payment of money as compensation. The amount of money that you may receive will depend on the specifics of the claim you submit. The potential amount of money to be paid to a Class Member whose claim is accepted will likely range from \$30,000 to \$350,000.

You must submit your claim for compensation before December 14, 2023. If you do not submit your claim for compensation before December 14, 2023, you will lose your right to compensation.
