We are pleased to announce that plans are set to hold a Parish Lenten Mission for members of St. Francis and St. Clare of Assisi. If you are wondering how to live a good Lent, MARK YOUR CALENDAR for the evenings of Monday, April 4th, to Thursday, April 7th, and join us!

Father Bill Burke will lead our Parish Lenten Mission. Fr. Burke is a native of Main-à-Dieu in Cape Breton. He graduated from St. Francis Xavier University, with a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1968. He taught secondary school English, French and Literature in the small town of Kadjebi, Ghana, with the Canadian University Services Overseas (CUSO) from 1968 to 1971. He then worked as a Social Worker in Toronto until 1973, when he entered St. Paul's Seminary in Ottawa. Ordained in 1977,



Fr. Burke has served in seven parishes in the Diocese of Antigonish. In 1985 he graduated with a master's degree in Liturgical Theology from the University of Notre Dame in Indiana.



Over the years, Fr. Burke has conducted numerous workshops, preached parish missions, and taught liturgy courses at the undergraduate level. For eleven years, he also served as a volunteer Chaplain with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) in Nova Scotia.

From November 2006 to August 2013, Fr. Burke was appointed the Director of the National Liturgy Office for the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops in Ottawa, before returning home to become Pastor of the newly created parish of St. Marguerite Bourgeoys in Sydney. He also serves as the pastor of St. Anne's Parish, Membertou.

We look forward to welcoming Fr. Burke to our Parish family! Plan now to attend! More details will be shared as they become available.

ATTENDING SUNDAY MASS

On Wednesday of this week, the province announced that it would be speeding up its reopening plans. The need to provide proof of vaccination for non-essential activities will end on February 28th, and Phase 2 of the plan will begin on March 7th.

As Phase 1 & 2 still require physical distancing, these changes will not have any positive effect on the numbers able to attend



Mass at St. Catherine's due to the size of our Church, therefore, the sharing of the seats available to us will continue until March 20th.

On March 21st, the province will be removing all COVID-19 restrictions.
