

An Update re: Church Buildings

The Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) met on June 28th, and one topic of discussion was the state of our Church buildings. The PPC heard anecdotally that some parishioners are concerned about the possibility that one or more of the Churches may need to close. This is a very understandable concern, and one that the PPC wishes to address in a transparent way so that parishioners are not placed in a situation of uncertainty.

When our four predecessor parishes amalgamated into the one Parish of St. Francis and St. Clare of Assisi, it created a situation in which we have one parish that has four church buildings. Naturally, as part of our coming together, it is necessary to assess our Parish resources, including our buildings, to determine what our needs are at present and in the future.

All our buildings are older structures that have been in use for many decades, and while they have, to varying degrees, been maintained over the years, they all have ongoing issues that need to be addressed. To properly understand the state of the buildings from a purely structural standpoint, the Parish in concert with the Archdiocese has commissioned qualified engineers to prepare a report in respect of each building. At the present time, the reports are in the process of being prepared.

Review of the reports will be carried out by the Parish Administrator with the support of several parishioners who are also professional engineers. The purpose of obtaining and reviewing the reports is to provide a clear picture of the physical state of the buildings, to identify any structural or other issues that each has, and to understand what work would be involved to address those issues and to continue to maintain the buildings in a state of repair that would be suitable to their ongoing use.

The information generated via the reports is one part - albeit an important part - of an overall process of assessing our Parish buildings and property needs moving forward. The PPC is engaged in a dialogue with our Parish Administrator and other members of Parish leadership (and possibly also representatives of the Archdiocese) to identify what that process looks like, who will have the ultimate responsibility for overseeing it, and on what timeline it will be carried out.

The PPC anticipates that there will be appropriate and regular communication with Parishioners in relation to this process and how it is proceeding. It is also anticipated that there will be an opportunity for parishioners to participate in information sessions and other opportunities for consultation.

Again, this entire review of our Church buildings is at an early stage, and a lot of the details about how it will move forward are still to be determined.

We would ask all parishioners to be patient as the process moves forward. No outcomes have been pre-determined, so please do not be concerned that decisions on Church closures are pre-cast - they are not. That said, we need to work together and think constructively about this issue, and we all need to keep an open mind and heart to the possibility that one or more Church closures may in fact be in our collective best interests moving forward.

Please pray for our Parish, for our Administrator, staff and our lay leaders, and for one another as we journey through these important decisions together. Your engagement will be an important part of that process, and we look forward to sharing information with you, and to receiving your feedback.

Diocesan News

Diaconate Ordination: August 10

On Thursday, August 10, Archbishop Dunn will ordain William (Bill) Grady to the permanent diaconate. The celebration will be at 7:00pm at Saint Mary's Cathedral Basilica. All are welcome!

In the early Church, some men were called to become deacons, ordained ministers who served the people of God under the direction of the Bishop.

The title "deacon" comes from the Greek word "diakonos," which means "servant." Though all Christians by baptism are called to "diakonia," or service, deacons serve as a public sacramental sign of Christ in and at the service of the world. Like a priest, a deacon is a member of the clergy who shares in the ministry of the Bishop. Unlike a priest, he may also have a wife, a family, and a secular job. The diaconate is a distinct vocation, or calling, to imitate Christ in His service to all humanity, to bring the world to Christ and Christ to the world.
