

SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY



This Sunday, the <u>Solemnity of</u> the Most Holy Trinity, we celebrate the central mystery of the Christian faith, the mystery of one God in three Divine Persons – God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. This teaching

is a Dogma of the Church. A Dogma is something that cannot be changed without changing the faith itself.

Emperor Constantine called for an Ecumenical (worldwide) Council, and in 325 A.D. at the Council of Nicea, the Church formally declared that Jesus is fully human and fully divine. The Nicene Creed, recalls the words from the Council of Nicea by professing that there is one God in three Divine Persons. The concept of a *person* is what makes each of us unique and distinct individuals. Each Divine Person is truly and fully God, yet fully distinct but not divided from one another.

NUNCIO MET WITH THE MI'KMAQ



On the morning of May 31st, the Apostolic Nuncio to Canada, the Most Reverend Ivan Jurkovič gathered with a group of Mi'kmaw for a

Listening Circle. The Papal Ambassador was joined by approximately 30 Mi'kmaw representatives that included Grand Chief Norman Sylliboy, Grand Keptin Antle Denny, residential school survivors, elders, and other members of Mi'kmaw communities from across the province.

During the Listening Circle many people shared their stories and experiences. Survivors spoke of their horrible and hurtful experiences at the residential school in Shubenacadie. Others spoke of the intergenerational trauma of these experiences. Chief Sylliboy and Keptin Denny re-iterated the 400 years of history between the Mi'kmaq nation and the Catholic Church and asked that Pope Francis come to Mi'mag'gi.

The Nuncio listened intently to all who offered their experiences. He thanked all who shared and expressed, on behalf of Pope Francis, recognition of the pain and suffering of the Indigenous peoples in Canada and the need to educate the Church about the history of Indigenous people and the residential school experience. It is his hope to move forward together to address the long-lasting impact of residential schools in Canada.

Last weekend, we celebrated the Feast of Pentecost – the birthday of the Church! To celebrate, Archbishop Dunn invited all the faithful to help our Church grow by inviting

others to know Christ – just as the Apostles did that first Pentecost! In his message to the faithful, he offered greetings but also an invitation:

"All of us know people who would benefit from encountering the risen Lord and experiencing the peace, joy, and purpose that a relationship with Christ brings. However, it can be intimidating to try to reach out and start a conversation about God or invite friends and family members to an event at our parish.

"Therefore, today, I invite you to join our invitation challenge. This four-session e-mail and video series helps you discover the process of effectively inviting someone you know to a parish evangelization program. It will also help you to be confident in sharing your faith with others."

Come and See! Philip invited Nicodemus to come and see the man from Nazareth who would change his life. We too are called to do the same: invite people to personally encounter Jesus we follow. This can sound like a daunting task. There is help! Sign up for a four-session e-mail and video series that will help you discover the process of effectively inviting someone you know to a parish evangelization program. It will also help you to be confident in sharing your faith with others.

The sessions that Archbishop Dunn is inviting people to will focus on how to invite, invoke, intercede, and invest. All this while knowing that the Holy Spirit, the principal agent of evangelization, helps us in each of these areas and gives us all the graces we need to act courageously.
