Pentecost Sunday June 5, 2022

PENTECOST SUNDAY



If you go back and read the Old Testament, you will discover that **Pentecost** was one of the Jewish feast days. Only they didn't call it Pentecost. The Jews called it the Feast of Harvest or the Feast of Weeks. It is

mentioned five places in the first five books— in Exodus 23, Exodus 24, Leviticus 16, Numbers 28, and Deuteronomy 16. It was the celebration of the beginning of the early weeks of harvest. In Palestine, there were two harvests each year. The early harvest came during the months of May and June; the final harvest came in the Fall. Pentecost was the celebration of the beginning of the early wheat harvest, which meant that Pentecost always fell sometime during the middle of the month of May or sometimes in early June.

Therefore Pentecost, in the time of the disciples, was a great and grand harvest celebration. The streets of Jerusalem would have been filled with thousands of pilgrims who had come from every point of the compass to celebrate the goodness of God and the bringing in of the wheat harvest. On Pentecost, the High Priest was to take two loaves of freshly baked wheat bread and offer them before the Lord. The wheat bread was made from the newly harvested wheat.

Pentecost is reminiscent of the Last Supper. In both instances, the disciples are together in a house for what proves to be an important event. At the Last Supper, the disciples witnessed the end of the Messiah's earthly ministry as He asks them to remember Him after His death until He returns. At Pentecost, the disciples witnessed the birth of the

New Testament church in the coming of the Holy Spirit to dwell in all believers.

Through our Baptism, we received the gifts of the Holy Spirit and at our Confirmation, we are sealed with these gifts. Those seven gifts of the Spirit, seven being a number of completeness and perfection, are the gifts of WISDOM, UNDERSTANDING, KNOWLEDGE, RIGHT JUDGEMENT, COURAGE, REVERENCE, and WONDER & AWE. These gifts allow us to discover and learn about the goodness of the world and other people, and to have the courage both to share our faith in Christ and to stand up for that faith.

RECONCILIATION FUND COLLECTION: JUNE 4TH & 5TH



Over the past ten weeks, the Diocese has shared information about the residential school system in Canada. As a Church, we are

truly sorry for the dark part of our history and the history of our country. Knowing these truths compels us to work toward healing and reconciliation. In recent months we have witnessed a variety of steps being made by the Canadian Bishops:

- a statement of apology in September 2021
- a national pledge of \$30 million to put towards initiatives and programs that promote healing and reconciliation in October 2021
- a delegation of Indigenous Peoples and Canadian bishops to Rome to meet with the Pope Francis in March 2022
- and most recently, the announcement of Pope Francis making pilgrimage of healing and reconciliation to Canada in July 2022.

Locally, Archbishop Dunn has repeatedly committed to walking with the local Mi'kmaw communities. Through listening circles and other moments of conversation, he has learned and listened to our Indigenous brothers and sisters. He will continue to create more opportunities to do so. One more tangible piece to this commitment is to financially give support to our walking together on the road towards healing, reconciliation, and hope.

This weekend, June 4th & 5th, the Diocese will take up its first Reconciliation Fund Collection. The monies collected will be used in Nova Scotia for

initiatives, supports, and programs that aid our efforts to heal the relationship between the Mi'kmaq and our local Church. Archbishop Dunn will discern the best use of these funds in conversation and collaboration with Mi'kmaw leaders and members of their communities.
